MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Oconee County Council was held Tuesday, February 18, 1986 at 3:00 PM in Council Chambers with all Council Members present.

Members of the press notified (by mail): Seneca Journal, Keowee Courier, Greenville News, Anderson Independent, WGOG Radio, WCCP Radio & WSNW Radio.

Members of the press present: Randall Holcombe - Seneca Journal, Dave Partenheimer - WSNW Radio, John Durham - WCCP Radio, George Allgood - WGOG Radio & Wayne Gallimore - WSNW Radio.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor-Chairman Crain who welcomed the guests and media.

The invocation was given by Mr. Butts.

Dr.Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 4-0 (Mr. Harper out of room) that the minutes of the February 4, 1986 meeting be adopted as printed.

First on the agenda was a discussion concerning the Farmer's Market/Pavilion in Seneca. Although the Honorable H. P. Covington, Mayor of Seneca was unable to attend the meeting, he did want to go on record as supporting the Farmer's Market/Pavilion in the City of Seneca. The Honorable Gregg Davis, Ms. Carol Field, Mr. Dean Boggs & The Honorable Tommy Powell addressed Council requesting funding for the proposed Farmer's Market/Pavilion in Seneca. They presented Council with the attached information. Mr. Wayne Gallimore also spoke requesting this funding. After considerable discussion in which Mr. Davis indicated Seneca would be responsible for the insurance, maintenance, upkeep and utilities and some of the Council Members pointed out they do feel it is a worthwhile project, but the time to request funding is during the budget process. Some of the Council Members felt it would be best if the Farmer Market were built on county owned property, however, Ms. Field pointed out that the Farmer's Market has already been established in the Seneca area. Ms. Jo Ann Murphree also stated it would be a good place for the ladies' clubs to meet.

After considerable discussion, Mr. Harper made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, defeated 3 - 2 (Mr. Butts, Mr. Dyar, & Dr. Earle voting against) requesting that Supervisor-Chairman Crain place \$15,000 in the proposed 1986-87 budget for this request. However, Mr. Crain did point out to them they could make a request for funding in the 1986-87 budget.

Mr. James A. Penney represented Northland Cable Television, Inc. and at their request Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Mr. Harper, approved 5 - 0 that Ordinance 86-1, "An Ordinance Approving & Granting Consent to the Assignment & Transfer to the Community Antenna Television Franchise & System from Video Properties, Ltd. to Northland Cable Television, Inc." be adopted on first reading in title only.

Mr. Harper made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5-0 that the attached transfer(s) be approved.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Dyar, approved 5-0 that money for temporary help in Soil & Water be taken from the Supervisor's part time help. The lady in Soil & Water will be out approximately six (6) weeks on maternity leave.

Dr. Earle requested a meeting of the Personnel & Intergovernmental Committee Tuesday, March 4, 1986 at 6:00 PM in Council Chambers to discuss insurance.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Butts, approved 5-0 that \$2,155.63 be taken from contingency for paint, etc. for the Blue Ridge Electric Building.

Dr. Earle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - 0 that Mr. Don Hinson and Mr. Larry Inabinet be invited to meet with Council to discuss the Jobs Training Partnership Act.

Mr. Butts made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 4 - 0 (Mr. Dyar out of room) that Oconee County place the bonding company on notice that Ace Overhead Door Co. cannot meet Oconee County's specifications for the hanger doors at the airport therefore, the contractor is in default and the bonding company will cause the contractor to meet the specifications or pay the difference it costs Oconee County to have the doors meet the specifications. Also the State Budget & Control Board is to be notified they no longer represent Oconee County in this matter.



Distinguished members of the Oconee City Council:

For many years, the idea of a Farmers Market/ Multi Purpose pavilion for Oconee County located in downtown Seneca has been considered. In the fall of 1983, the Seneca City Council commissioned an architect to draw a design for a Farmers Market/multi purpose pavilion. Also in 1983, the Seneca City Council commissioned the Clemson Architecture Foundation to make a study of Downtown Seneca. These studies indicated a need for a Farmers Market/Pavilion. This year, the City Council commissioned Rural Development Associates of Columbia to do a market analysis for the Greater Seneca area. This study also strongly endorsed the concept of a Farmers Market/Pavilion.

In September of 1985, the Clemson Agricultural Extension Service and The S.U.R.E. Farmers Market task force met with the Oconee County Council to settle questions regarding the proposed Farmers Market/Pavilion. At that time, as requested by the Oconee County Council we demonstrated:

- 1) the need for a Farmers Market/Pavilion
- 2) the rationale for location
- 3) the Farmers View of the proposed location and design
- 4) the City of Seneca's concerns
- 5) and the cost breakdown of the project and the way it is to be funded and built.

In December of 1985, the Clemson Agricultural Extension Service and the S.U.R.E. Farmers Market task force met with the Farmers Market Task Force of the Oconee County Council to again answer questions. At that time, as requested by the Oconee County Council, we demonstrated:

- 1) A firm commitment by the City of Seneca to raise 2/3 of the \$270,000 estimated cost.
- 2) The support of downtown Seneca merchants and property owners.
- 3) The support of other Oconee County communities while again, reiterating the need, location, design and cost.

Today we have returned to this Council to again ask for a commitment to this project. As requested by the Oconee County Council, not only have we raised support from other Oconee County communities we are presenting over 2000 signatures of Oconee County citizens at large supporting this project; and to demonstrate that this is a county wide project, the Mayor of Salem will speak on behalf of the project. In addition, as requested by this Council, we have obtained a favorable Court ruling, allowing the City to build on the proposed site. Furthermore, we come with a commitment from The City of Seneca to fund the project if the County will raise its share. Councilman Greg Davis is the city's official representative here today.

The Farmers Market multi-use Pavilion project has more broad based public support of any project of its size brought before this council. The farmers of Oconee County, citizens at large, other Oconee County cities, the City of Seneca, Downtown Merchants, the Agricultural Extension Service, Tri-County Tech and a host of others have publically endorsed this project. We have answered every question and request that you have made. Today we request a decision be made.

Therefore, the Cooperative Agricultural Extension Service, The City of Seneca and S.U.R.E. Committee, Inc. requests the Oconee County Council for \$30,000 per year starting fiscal year July 1, 1986 for three years to help build a Farmers Market/Multi-Use Pavilion in downtown Seneca.


