As chairman of the Oconee County ATAX committee, I would like the following request to be placed on the agenda for the next County Council meeting.

The Oconee County ATAX committee would like to request a grant of \$1100 to be taken from the ATAX fund. This money will be used to provide materials, printing, postage, and literature for the upcoming Conference on Tourism the ATAX committee is hosting on Saturday, November 6 at the State Park. The bulk of the funds will be to provide 75 copies of the award-winning workbook by Dr. Tom Potts, our featured speaker. Funds will also be used to purchase copies of the Oconee County map published by Merchant Maps.

Tourism could become a multi-million dollar industry here in Oconee County. The purpose of this conference is to lay the ground work to develop this growth industry. To this effect, the workbook designed by Dr. Potts will be distributed to all members of the County Council, all Mayors, Chambers, and county officials who are invited to the conference. TOURISM IS ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT THAT BENEFITS YOUR COMMUNITY

Faced with declining manufacturing and agricultural activities, many southeastern counties and communities are seeking new ways to sustain economic growth and increase employment. Each year brings new conferences and meetings by community planners and developers to discuss ways to put new life into the sagging economy of some southeastern areas.

But so often community leaders fail to recognize the one industry that in recent years has been creating new jobs, income, and tax revenues—tourism.

THE SOUTHEAST'S TRAVEL AND RECREATION INDUSTRY

Tourism is a great way to produce jobs. In fact, you create more jobs with a smaller investment. Tourism has created more jobs than the U.S. average all the way back to 1973. Tourism often employs people who need jobs most, such as women, minorities, and youth. Tourism often employs people who do not want technical jobs and/or those who want to work only part-time or seasonally. Tourism jobs are recession fighters as shown in the fact that in the last two national recessions, tourism continued to produce new jobs.

ECONOMIC IMPACT

The tourist can make a significant contribution to the local economy. They purchase goods and services locally and pay taxes at the same rate as local residents, although they do not consume or use local services very much.

An additional 100 tourists per day can have a great economic impact as seen in figure 1. Any industry with such a tremendous potential should certainly deserve investigation.

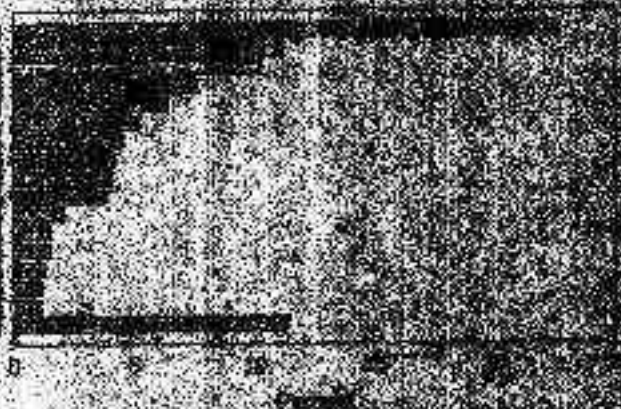

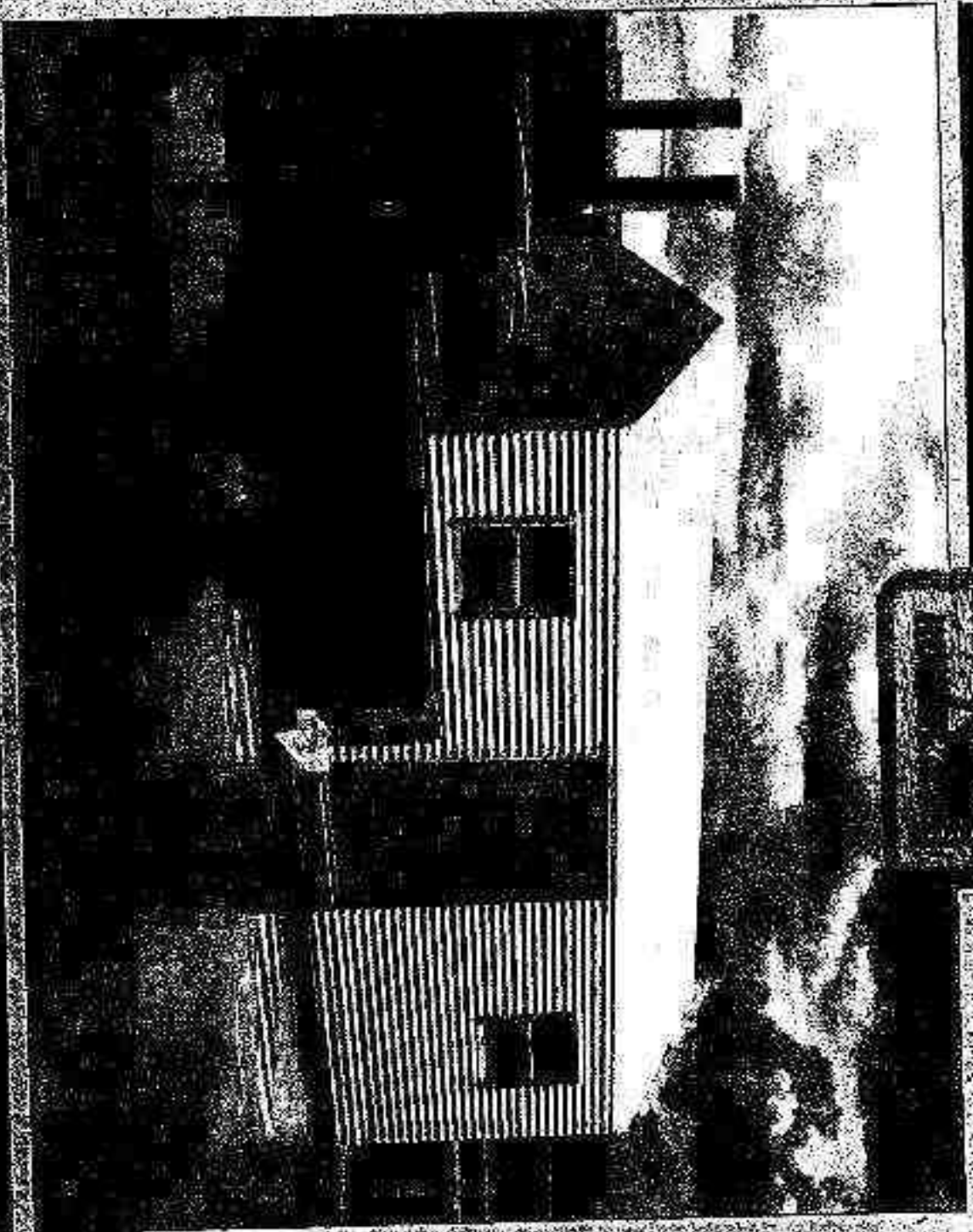

PENDLETON DISTRICT PRIVATE INDUSTRY COUNCIL
SERVING ANDERSON, OCONEE AND PICKENS COUNTIES
STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA

ARTICLE I. ESTABLISHMENT OF THE PRIVATE INDUSTRY COUNCIL

- A. THE PENDLETON DISTRICT PRIVATE INDUSTRY COUNCIL (PIC) IS ESTABLISHED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE JOB TRAINING PARTNERSHIP ACT (JTPA) [PL 97-300] AS AMENDED BY THE JOB TRAINING REFORM AMENDMENTS OF 1992 [PL 102-367] (HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE ACT); TITLE I, PART A., SECTION 102.

ARTICLE II. FUNCTIONS OF THE PRIVATE INDUSTRY COUNCIL

- A. THE FUNCTIONS OF THE PRIVATE INDUSTRY COUNCIL (PIC) ARE ESTABLISHED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE JOB TRAINING PARTNERSHIP ACT (JTPA) AS AMENDED BY THE JOB TRAINING REFORM AMENDMENTS OF 1992 (HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE ACT); TITLE I, PART A., SECTION 103.

ARTICLE III. NAME OF THE PRIVATE INDUSTRY COUNCIL

- A. THE NAME OF THIS BOARD (SERVING ANDERSON, OCONEE AND PICKENS COUNTIES UNDER THE ACT) SHALL BE THE PENDLETON DISTRICT PRIVATE INDUSTRY COUNCIL, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE PIC.

ARTICLE IV. THE PENDLETON DISTRICT PRIVATE INDUSTRY COUNCIL (PIC)

- A. MEMBERSHIP
1. NUMBER
 - a. THE TOTAL MEMBERSHIP OF THE PIC SHALL BE TWENTY-SIX (26). MEMBERSHIP FROM EACH COUNTY SHALL BE TO THE DEGREE POSSIBLE IN THE SAME PERCENTAGE AS THAT COUNTY'S PERCENTAGE OF THE TOTAL POPULATION OF ALL THREE COUNTIES USING THE LATEST CENSUS DATA AVAILABLE.
 2. APPOINTMENTS AND COMPOSITION
 - a. PIC MEMBERS SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE CHIEF ELECTED OFFICIAL (CEO) OF THE RESPECTIVE COUNTY AND THE PIC'S COMPOSITION WILL BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 102(a) OF THE ACT.

3. TERM OF OFFICE

- a. PURSUANT TO SECTION 102(f) OF THE ACT, PIC MEMBERS SHALL BE APPOINTED FOR FIXED AND STAGGERED TERMS AND MAY SERVE UNTIL THEIR SUCCESSORS ARE APPOINTED. ANY VACANCY IN THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE PIC SHALL BE FILLED IN THE SAME MANNER AS THE ORIGINAL APPOINTMENT. ANY PIC MEMBER MAY BE REMOVED FOR CAUSE IN ACCORDANCE WITH PROCEDURES ESTABLISHED BY THE PIC.
- b. UNDER THE ORIGINAL PIC BYLAWS WHICH WERE EXECUTED IN 1988 TO GOVERN THE INITIAL PIC, THE FIRST TERM OF ALL PIC MEMBERS AND PIC OFFICERS SHALL BE DEEMED TO HAVE BEGUN ON JULY 01, 1988. IN THAT FIRST YEAR, ONE THIRD OF THE PIC WERE APPOINTED FOR ONE YEAR, ONE THIRD FOR TWO YEARS, AND ONE THIRD FOR THREE YEARS.
- c. THEREFORE, ALL CURRENT APPOINTMENTS ARE FOR A THREE YEAR TERM STAGGERED TERM. ONE THIRD OF THE PIC MEMBERSHIP IS UP FOR REPLACEMENT OR REAPPOINTMENT JULY 01 OF EACH YEAR. APPOINTMENTS TO FILL A VACANCY ON THE PIC WILL BE TO FILL THE UNEXPIRED TERM OF THE PIC MEMBER BEING REPLACED.

4. CATEGORIES OF MEMBERSHIP

- a. CATEGORIES OF MEMBERSHIP COMPRISING THE PIC WILL BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 102(a) OF THE ACT.

5. RESIGNATIONS

- a. ANY PIC MEMBER MAY RESIGN BY NOTIFYING THE PIC CHAIRMAN IN WRITING. THIS NOTICE SHALL SPECIFY THE REASON AND EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE RESIGNATION. THE CHIEF ELECTED OFFICIAL OF THE COUNTY AFFECTED WILL BE ADVISED AND SHALL APPOINT AN INDIVIDUAL TO COMPLETE THE UNEXPIRED TERM OF THE RESIGNING PIC MEMBER.

B. OFFICERS

1. CHAIRMAN

- a. REFERENCE SECTION 102(b) OF THE ACT, THE CHAIRMAN SHALL BE SELECTED FROM AMONG MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL (PIC) WHO ARE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE PRIVATE SECTOR.
- b. THE PIC CHAIRMAN SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE THREE CHIEF ELECTED OFFICIALS FOR AN INDEFINITE TERM AND SERVE AT THEIR PLEASURE.
- c. THE PIC CHAIRMAN SHALL PRESIDE AT ALL PIC MEETINGS AND EXECUTE ON BEHALF OF THE PIC ALL OFFICIAL INSTRUMENTS AND DOCUMENTS AUTHORIZED BY THE PIC OR THE ACT.
- d. THE PIC CHAIRMAN SHALL MAKE ALL PIC COMMITTEE ASSIGNMENTS.
- e. THE PIC CHAIRMAN SHALL CALL SPECIAL MEETINGS OF THE PIC OR PIC COMMITTEES IF HE DETERMINES SUCH CALLED MEETINGS ARE IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE PIC OR AS REQUESTED BY ONE-THIRD OF THE MEMBERSHIP AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION C, PARAGRAPH 4.

2. VICE-CHAIRMAN

- a. THE PIC VICE-CHAIRMAN SHALL BE APPOINTED BY AND SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF THE PIC CHAIRMAN.
- b. THE PIC VICE-CHAIRMAN SHALL PERFORM THE DUTIES OF THE PIC CHAIRMAN IN THE EVENT OF THE PIC CHAIRMAN'S ABSENCE.

3. OTHER OFFICERS

- a. THE PIC CAN ELECT OTHER OFFICERS AS THE MEMBERSHIP DEEMS APPROPRIATE OR NECESSARY TO FULFILL THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PIC.

C. MEETINGS AND ATTENDANCE

1. ORDER OF BUSINESS

- a. THE ORDER OF BUSINESS FOR THE MEETINGS SHALL BE DETERMINED BY THE PIC CHAIRMAN.

2. RULES OF ORDER

- b. ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER, NEWLY REVISED, SHALL GOVERN THE CONDUCT OF THE PIC AND ITS COMMITTEES DURING ALL THEIR BUSINESS DELIBERATIONS...EXCEPT AS MODIFIED BY STATUTE, RULE, OR THESE PIC BYLAWS.

3. NOTICE OF MEETINGS

- a. WRITTEN NOTICE OF EACH PIC MEETING OR PIC COMMITTEE MEETING STATING THE PLACE, DATE AND TIME OF THE MEETING SHALL BE GIVEN TO EACH PIC MEMBER, BY MAIL OR PERSONALLY, NOT LESS THAN TEN (10) CALENDAR DAYS PRIOR TO THE MEETING.
- b. PIC MEETINGS AND PIC COMMITTEE MEETINGS SHALL BE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC, EXCEPT WHEN THE MEETING CONVENES IN EXECUTIVE SESSION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT. VOTES TAKEN DURING AN EXECUTIVE SESSION MUST BE RATIFIED BY THE PIC IN OPEN SESSION.

4. SCHEDULE OF MEETINGS

- a. THE PIC AND ITS COMMITTEES SHALL MEET AS NECESSARY TO CONDUCT OFFICIAL BUSINESS.
- b. PIC MEETINGS WILL BE CALLED BY THE PIC CHAIRMAN OR UPON WRITTEN REQUESTS OF NOT LESS THAN ONE-THIRD (1/3) OF THE PIC MEMBERS.
- c. PIC COMMITTEE MEETINGS WILL BE CALLED BY PIC CHAIRMAN AND/OR THE COMMITTEE'S CHAIRMAN OR UPON WRITTEN REQUESTS OF NOT LESS THAN ONE-THIRD (1/3) OF THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE AFFECTED COMMITTEE.

5. QUORUM

- a. ONE-THIRD (1/3) OF THE PIC MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING SHALL CONSTITUTE A QUORUM FOR THE PURPOSE OF TRANSACTING BUSINESS OF THE PIC.
- b. ONE-THIRD (1/3) OF A PIC COMMITTEE'S MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING SHALL CONSTITUTE A QUORUM FOR THE PURPOSE OF THAT COMMITTEE TRANSACTING OFFICIAL BUSINESS.
- c. IN EITHER OF THE ABOVE, IN THE ABSENCE OF A QUORUM THE MEETING SHALL BE ADJOURNED UNTIL SUCH TIME A QUORUM CAN BE CONVENED.

6. ATTENDANCE

- a. EACH MEMBER OF THE PIC SHALL BE EXPECTED TO ATTEND ALL MEETINGS OF THE PIC AND HIS OR HER ASSIGNED COMMITTEE MEETINGS UNLESS EXCUSED BY THE PIC CHAIRMAN.
- b. EXCUSED ABSENCES MUST BE FOR GOOD CAUSE.
- c. ANY MEMBER WHO EXCEEDS TWO (2) ABSENCES FROM SCHEDULED PIC MEETINGS AND/OR TWO (2) ABSENCES FROM SCHEDULED ASSIGNED COMMITTEE MEETINGS DURING THE PERIOD (JULY 1 THROUGH JUNE 30 EACH PROGRAM YEAR) "MAY" BE ASKED BY THE PIC CHAIRMAN AT HIS DISCRETION TO TENDER A WRITTEN RESIGNATION. THIS POLICY APPLIES TO EXCUSED AND UNEXCUSED ABSENCES.

D. VOTING

1. VOTING AUTHORITY

- a. VOTES SHALL BE CAST ONLY BY DULY APPOINTED PIC MEMBERS PRESENT. THERE ARE NO PROVISIONS FOR VOTING BY PROXY OR AN ALTERNATE/REPRESENTATIVE OF A PIC MEMBER WHO IS NOT PRESENT.

- b. PERSONS SENT TO REPRESENT ABSENT PIC MEMBERS AND VISITORS IN THE AUDIENCE MAY PARTICIPATE IN PIC BUSINESS DISCUSSIONS ONLY IF RECOGNIZED BY THE PIC CHAIRMAN AND THERE IS NO CONFLICT OF INTEREST; HOWEVER, NEITHER MAY MAKE MOTIONS NOR CAST VOTES.

2. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

- a. NO MEMBER OF THE PIC SHALL MAKE A MOTION, VOTE ON, OR BE A PARTY TO THE BUSINESS DISCUSSION OF ANY MATTER BEFORE THE PIC WHICH HAS A DIRECT BEARING ON SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY THAT MEMBER OR ANY ORGANIZATION WHICH THAT MEMBER REPRESENTS.
- b. EACH INCIDENCE OF SUCH POTENTIAL CONFLICT OF INTEREST SHALL BE DECLARED BY THE AFFECTED PIC MEMBER [PRIOR TO ANY DISCUSSION] AND SHALL BE SO NOTED IN THE OFFICIAL MINUTES

3. VOTING

- a. EACH VOTING PIC MEMBER SHALL HAVE ONE (1) VOTE.
- b. NO VOTES SHALL BE TAKEN BY SECRET BALLOT.
- c. A ROLL-CALL VOTE MAY BE CALLED FOR BY ANY VOTING MEMBER OF THE PIC, AND SHALL BE NOTED IN THE PIC MINUTES.

E. COMMITTEES

1. ORGANIZATION

- a. THE PIC CHAIRMAN SHALL DESIGNATE THE ESTABLISHMENT OF PIC COMMITTEES DEEMED NECESSARY TO CONDUCT THE FUNCTIONS OF THE PIC.
- b. A CONSCIENTIOUS EFFORT SHALL BE MADE TO HAVE EACH COUNTY FAIRLY REPRESENTED ON ALL PIC COMMITTEES.
- c. THE PIC CHAIRMAN SHALL BE AN EX-OFFICIO MEMBER OF EACH PIC COMMITTEE AND IS WITHOUT VOTING PRIVILEGE, EXCEPT TO BREAK A TIE VOTE.

2. NOTICE OF PIC COMMITTEE MEETINGS

- a. NOTICE OF PIC COMMITTEE MEETINGS SHALL BE MADE TO ALL PIC MEMBERS.
- b. PIC MEMBERS MAY ATTEND ANY PIC COMMITTEE MEETING; HOWEVER, VOTING IS RESTRICTED TO A COMMITTEE'S DESIGNATED MEMBERS.
- c. PIC COMMITTEE MEETINGS SHALL BE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC, EXCEPT WHEN THE COMMITTEE CONVENES IN EXECUTIVE SESSION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT. VOTES TAKEN DURING AN EXECUTIVE SESSION OF ANY PIC COMMITTEE MUST BE RATIFIED IN OPEN SESSION.

3. REPRESENTATION

- a. A PIC COMMITTEE MEMBER WHO IS UNABLE TO ATTEND A SCHEDULED COMMITTEE MEETING MAY SEND A REPRESENTATIVE. SUCH INDIVIDUALS AND GUESTS MAY PARTICIPATE IN THE DISCUSSIONS BEFORE THE COMMITTEE ONLY WHEN RECOGNIZED BY THE PIC COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN, BUT MAY NOT MAKE MOTIONS OR VOTE.

4. EXECUTIVE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

- a. THE EXECUTIVE ADVISORY COMMITTEE IS HEREBY ESTABLISHED TO PROVIDE FOR CONTINUITY OF PURPOSE AND CONTINUED GUIDANCE AND ASSISTANCE TO THE PENDLETON DISTRICT PRIVATE INDUSTRY COUNCIL.
- b. MEMBERSHIP OF THIS COMMITTEE IS RESERVED ONLY FOR THOSE WHO HAVE SERVED IN THE PAST AS PIC CHAIRMAN.
- c. TERM OF OFFICE IS INDEFINITE.


5. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- a. THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE PENDLETON DISTRICT PRIVATE INDUSTRY COUNCIL SHALL BE COMPRISED OF THE PIC CHAIRMAN, THE PIC VICE-CHAIRMAN, AND THE CHAIRMAN OF EACH OF THE PIC COMMITTEES.
- b. THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MAY BE DESIGNATED BY THE PIC TO ACT ON ITS BEHALF BETWEEN REGULAR PIC MEETINGS TO EXPEDITE THE DECISION-MAKING PROCESS AND TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH THE ACT, REGULATIONS AND FEDERAL/STATE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES.
- c. SUCH ACTIONS BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE WILL BE REPORTED BY THE PIC CHAIRMAN TO THE FULL PIC AT THE NEXT REGULARLY SCHEDULED BUSINESS MEETING AND WILL BE INCLUDED IN THE MINUTES OF THE PIC BUSINESS MEETING.

F. AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS


1. THESE BYLAWS MAY BE AMENDED OR REPEALED ONLY IF PROPOSED ACTION HAS BEEN PRESENTED IN WRITING TO EACH PIC MEMBER AND EACH CHIEF ELECTED OFFICIAL AT LEAST FIFTEEN (15) CALENDAR DAYS PRIOR TO A VOTE OF THE PIC, AND
2. THERE IS A SEVENTY-FIVE PERCENT (75%) VOTE OF THOSE PIC MEMBERS PRESENT IN FAVOR OF SUCH AMENDMENTS AT A PIC MEETING WHERE A QUORUM IS PRESENT.
3. THESE PIC BYLAWS SHALL BE DEEMED TO BE AUTOMATICALLY AMENDED TO CONFORM WITH STATE AND FEDERAL STATUTES AND REGULATIONS, AS REQUIRED.
