# Results of Increases

- Transfer Station permit allows for 300 tons per day. With increase in waste, 2 days per week typically reaches 250-290 tons. Waste is left on floor of Transfer Station most days. (Does not include Pendleton T.S. closing)
- Pendleton T.S. averaged approx. 100 tons per day.
- Landfill takes 2 operators daily to maintain DHEC regulatory compliance. Use to only take 1 person per day except when covering. Does not include maintenance such as mowing 75+ acres, sediment pond clean outs, gas and water wells, and storm water inspections and sampling.

# Results of Increases

- Average recyclable pull is currently 3-4 days after it is called in even after adding pulls on Wednesdays if operators are available.
- Use to grind mulch only one day per week to keep pad clean, now takes 2-3 times per week. Due to staffing levels, choice has to be made between mulch grinding or picking up recyclables. (Brush/yard waste feedstock is DHEC regulated)

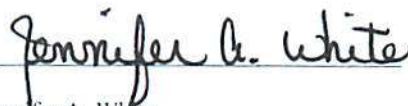
