I do however want to mention a couple of items that relate to the Comprehensive Plan update.

Goal 2, Objective 4:

It is in the best interest of the county to utilize all of the funding mechanisms that are available. This includes not only special tax districts but redevelopment districts which utilize Tax. Incremental Financing. Many other jurisdiction have used TIF districts to capitalize infrastructure for many years we need to also implement these strategies. By doing so the new development is paying for the infrastructure that benefits the entire county.

Development impact fees are counter productive especially considering developers are already footing the bill for the roads, water, sewer, power, right of ways and upgrades to roads impacted by residential development. Oconee County has all the tools it needs to finance infrastructure without resorting to draconian taxation by way of impact fees.

Goal 2, Objective 7:

In regards to creating employment opportunities for Oconee County, the county must work towards a very diverse economic development plan.
