County Council members,

Oconee County currently has 90 police officers and according to national standards 120 officers would be the

recommended minimum for our County's population. Due to the large geographic size of the County having
additional uniformed-patrol officers to respond to citizen's in-need is critical. Other divisions within the Sheriff's
office including Narcotics, Cyber-crime, and the Child/Elder abuse investigations units would benefit from a
staffing increase. The Planning Commission recommends County Council fund the Sheriff's Office to hire at least
eight more officers in the coming fiscal year and supply funds to pay our current officers at or above regional
pay-rates.
