- 1. Call to order Mr. Smith called the meeting to order at 5:00pm.
- 2. Invocation was led by Mr. Nix
- 3. Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mr. Johnson
- 4. Approval of minutes for June 7, 2021– Mr. Gaulin made a motion to approve the June 7<sup>th</sup> minutes. Seconded by Mr. Johnson and the vote approved 6/0.
- 5. Public comment for non-agenda items None
- 6. Ed Halbig, Planning Director for the City of Seneca Presented a brief overview of public transportation via the CATbus and the potential for expansion. Discussion included:
  - a. The duality of Walhalla as a municipality and the County Seat of Oconee and the need for citizens of Oconee County to have access to County services.
  - b. Expansion must be a partnership between the City of Seneca/CATbus and the other municipalities and the County
  - c. Interest of expansion has been voiced, but no serious conversations are taking place
  - d. Safety concerns regarding designated bus stops, lack of sidewalks and crime on buses

Mr. Halbig thanked the Commission for the opportunity to open the dialogue regarding public transportation.

- 7. Commission member comments Mr. Smith reminded Commission Members that the next meeting is scheduled for July 8, 2021, which is a Thursday, not a Monday as usual. He also reported that Kyle Reid with Oconee County Roads & Bridges is tentatively scheduled to attend the July 19<sup>th</sup> meeting and discuss Exit 4 and sidewalks. Mr. Gaulin expressed his desire to properly thank invited speakers, for example sending thank you notes. Ms. Kompier and Mr. Gaulin will discuss details. Mr. Williams thanked all Commission Members for their service.
- 8. Staff Comments Ms. Kompier gave an update on the Planning Department
- 9. Agricultural Advisory Board Meeting Report Mr. Smith and Mr. Williams attended the June 14<sup>th</sup> Agricultural Advisory Board meeting to open dialogue and form a working relationship where beneficial, specifically the protection of agricultural land now and in the future. Mr. Williams reported that support from the community regarding protecting ag land is growing, there are a lot of ideas on what to do, but there is no plan. Mr. Williams believes that education of the land owners will be critical to finding the solution. Mr. Williams will meet with Mr. Blanton from the Ag Board to further the dialogue and form a plan. Mr. Johnson and Mr. Nix agreed that the positive effects of zoning need to be considered. Mr. Smith stated the strategy for Protecting Ag Land will be moved over to the Planning Commission's open items list and Mr. Williams will be the lead on formulating an action plan and keeping the Commission up-to-date.
- 10. 2021 Strategies Review Mr. Smith reminded members that as they review the strategies, to keep in mind what is achievable and attainable. Item #3, Protect ag land (8.1.1.4, 6.2.1), can be checked off as reviewed and moved to the open item list. Item #5, Road Maintenance Planning (9.3.3.2, 9.3.2.2), will remain open. Mr. Gaulin made a motion to accept the strategies category list as written to help move the review process forward. Mr. Johnson seconded. The discussion included:
  - a. Concern that there are no strategies that have been categorized as 1 or 2, which require Planning Commission action. Mr. Smith advised the current strategies listed as 1-5 will be re-categorized as CAT 1.
  - b. Issue with sewer system in Oconee County should be a Category 1 Mr. Smith reminded Commission that the motion is to accept the **process** of reviewing strategies, not to review the strategies.

Mr. Gaulin restated the motion; Mr. Johnson seconded and the vote approved 6/0. The review of strategies list yielded these results:

- a. 3.1.1.3 falls under Item #3 on the open items list and the category will be changed to category #3.
- b. 3.2.1.4 COVID-19 bill has money for rehabbing and building affordable housing and Administrator is working through the process to be considered for funds. Strategy was marked as review complete.
- c. 4.3.2.5 under the purview of the Oconee Economic Alliance. Strategy was marked as review complete.

- d. 5.1.1.2 Litter Control Ordinance was recently revised in ordinance #2021-09 and the County has posted a position for a Code Enforcement Officer. Strategy was marked as review complete.
- e. 5.1.2.1 Ordinance 2021-11 was recently passed and protects historical buildings and monuments. Strategy was marked as review complete.
- f. 5.1.2.4 Oconee Economic Alliance has two developers actively completing their due diligence on the Utica Mill Area. Strategy was marked as review complete.
- 11. Adjourn Mr. Nix made a motion for adjournment. Seconded by Mr. Pearson and unanimously passed 5/0 at 6:17 PM.

**CAT 1** Housing (3.1.1.1,3.1.1.4/3.1.2) #14 topic most mentioned at community meetings— Review and amend land use plans and regulations to identify and remove possible barriers to the development of a variety of housing options and residential development.

**Review**- Housing white paper sent to county council on April, 2021. **Review completed** 6/7

CAT 1 Entertainment and Recreation – (5.3.1.1, 5.3.1.3,7.3.1.4, 2.1.2.3) #1 topic most mentioned at community meetings. PC should send letter to the Tourism Board letting them know the local residents may be unfamiliar with all there is to do in the area. Web site visitoconeesc.com highlights calendar of events monthly. Invite Ken Sloan to speak.

**Review** – Riley Johnson – Seneca and Ken Sloan – county tourism manager made presentations to PC. Asked for support of 2% Hospitality Tax to support tourism. Greenway Feasibility and Implementation funds in budget. **Review completed** 6/7

**CAT 1** Protect ag land (8.1.1.4, 6.2.1) #21 topic most mentioned at community meetings. Limit non-ag development in productive and prime ag areas to densities and development patterns that are consistent with the continuation of viable ag.

**Review** – Pat agreed to review. Some suggestions: (Development Standards) - Screening, Zoning, Revise zoning ord to add Ag 5/50 Zoning categories, Urban growth boundaries, Conservation Easement, consult Ag Board. **Review completed** 6/21 – Protect Ag land moved to open item list.

**CAT 1** Downtown Retail – (4.3.1.1, 5.3.2.3) #3 topic most mentioned at community meetings –

**Review** – No action required. **Review completed** 6/7

**CAT 1** Road Maintenance Planning – (9.3.3.2, 9.3.2.2) #5 topic most mentioned at community meetings- sidewalks, bike lanes, etc.) Ask CAT bus where they are planning for future expansion. Continue the discussion of sidewalks to

identify if our current ordinance is good 'as is' or if it needs revision to certain areas or corridors.

**Review** – Sidewalk discussion. Schedule CAT bus rep for future plans in county. Review recent SCDOT improvement of Route 24 and other roads recently announced for paving.

**CAT 3** 3.1.1.3 – (No comments received from community meetings) Review and amend land use plans and regulations relevant policies and proposed residential developments to ensure compatibility between new residential developments and existing ag uses.

**Review** – See #3 above. (Development Standards) - Screening between incompatible entities. Zoning, Revise zoning ordinance to include Ag 5/50 categories, Urban growth boundaries. **Review completed** 6/21 refer to Protect Ag Land page 1.

**CAT 4** 3.2.1.4 – (No comments received from community meetings) Work with the state and other organizations to identify and secure funding for housing and neighborhood rehabilitation for declining and unsafe residential areas through the public, non-profit and private sectors.

**Review-** There is funding in Covid 19 bill - \$213 billion for 'retrofitting and building affordable housing' (WSJ, April2, 2021) How much and when will it reach Oconee?? "Rehabbed and Ready" 20 billion in tax credits to refurbish housing. (WSJ-May 25) **Review completed** 6/21

**CAT 3** 4.3.2.5 – (4 comments received at community meetings) Identify projects and promote Opportunity Zone Incentive areas.

**Review** – Opportunity Zone are economically distressed communities that may qualify for tax capital gain deferment. Oconee Economic Alliance can best identify these areas and contact parties interested in this type investment. **Review completed** 6/21

   Review Around Lakes Keowee and Jocassee, funds are available to create, enhance and protect fish and wildlife habitats along the shores. When docks are installed a fee (\$400?) is added by Duke for habitat enhancement.
