Subject: Ridge Road WH-3

Facts

The Transportation Committee, at the December 13, 2012, meeting, directed staff to evaluate Ridge Road from maintenance cost versus a paving cost.

The following summarizes the evaluation:

- The length of County maintained road was measured for Ridge Road and McGee Road.
- The actual tens of stone used to maintain the roads for the last 5 years was obtained from County Rock Quarry.
- Based on the above data, the average cost per mile, per year for stone is \$1,610.
- The approximate material cost for stone and asphalt to construct a paved section of Ridge Road from Little River Road to McGee Road (8,650 ft or 1.6 miles) would cost approximately \$180,000.
- For the same \$180,000, Ridge Road could be maintained for 68 years as a gravel road.

Subject: Butts Farm Road

Facts

The Transportation Committee, at the April 10, 2012. meeting, directed staff to evaluate Butts Farm Road. The following summarizes the evaluation:

- Butts Farm Road is a gravel road located off of Rock Fork Road in the Pulaski Township.
- The first 3.623' of Butts Farm Road is maintained via a prescriptive easement by Oconee County Roads and Bridges Department,
- The next 2,700 is maintained by others,
- No deeded easements or right-of-ways are on file regarding the road, and
- The road provides access to 9 properties.

The following are challenges:

- Several existing fences and gates will have to be relocated (no closer than 25' from the proposed centerline of the road),
- . Right-of-Way for the entire road will need to be obtained including a Cul-de-Sac,
- The entire road will have to be paved.
- · "In-house" construction of the road would be budgeted to cost \$225,000.

Subject: C-Funding Update

Road Paving 2011-2012 (2)

Facts

The County Council, at the June 9, 2012 meeting, approved the execution of the Road Paving 2011-2012 (2) contract with Hubbard Paving and Grading, Inc. Roads had to be deleted from the ITB because of limited funding.

- It may be possible to obtain additional funding, specifically C-fund money.
- The roads that were deleted from Road Paving 2011-2012
 (2) are as follows: Country Acres Rd/WA-219, Ashley
 Dr/WA-271, Pawnee Dr/WA-303, and Lake Point East/SE-306.
- Seneca wishes to add Bee St/SE-391 to Road Paving 2011-2012 (2) If C-Fund money is obtained, to complete the Utica Mill sewer upgrade project.
- If additional funding is obtained, the priority would be Ashley Dr/WA-271, Pawnee Dr/WA-303, Bee St/SE-391, Country Acres Rd/WA-219, and Lake Point East/SE-306.

Recommendations.

If the Transportation Committee wishes to add the deleted roads back to the contract, the C-Fund Committee would have to be provided a list of roads and estimated project cost. Additionally, the Transportation Committee could recommend that County Council consider authorizing the Administrator to approve a change order to the Road Paving 2011-2012 (2) contract that adds roads that were bid but were deleted due to limited funding and add Bee St at the request of the City of Seneca (contingent upon receiving additional funding).



Subject: Land Bridge Grant from US Forest Services

Facts

The County has been approved to obtain a \$96,000 grant from the Francis Marion Sumter Resource Advisory Committee (FMS RAC) to help fund the replacement of Lands Bridge.

- The funding will assist with the more complex engineering and environmental permitting typically required on federal lands.
- Lands Bridge was our number 3 priority on the "Proposed Bridges and Culverts needing Attention" at the September 22, 2009, Transportation Committee Meeting.
- Total cost for the replacement of the bridge has been estimated to be approximately \$500,000.
- The Forest Service has asked that agreements be signed as soon as possible, so funding can be programmed.
- Entering into the agreements allows the local Forest Service Engineer to work closely with the County to assist with public hearings, environmental permitting and various Federal requirements that tend to slow projects down.
