Final Project Score Calculation

The Capital Project Advisory Committee (CPAC) review of each proposed capital project includes consideration of the various considerations associated with the criteria specified in the Evaluation Section. The CPAC establishes a Raw Score for each of the considerations, which is then multiplied by the Weight Point for each of the criteria. The resulting Weighted Scores are then totaled to establish the Total Project Score.

A maximum of 570 points may be awarded to a project.
