MINUTES, SPECIAL MEETING, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL

The Oconee County Council held a special meeting hursday, April 1, 1993 at 10:00 AM in Council Chambers with all ouncil Members present. Mr. Timothy Cain, County Attorney was lso present.

Members of the press notified: Journal/Tribune, eowee Courier, Westminster News, Anderson Independent, Greenille News, WGOG Radio, WBFM Radio, WYFF TV & WLOS TV.

Members of the press present: Dick Mangrum - GOG Radio & Ron Barnett - Greenville News.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor-hairman Crain.

The invocation as given by Mr. Williams.

The purpose of the meeting was for Mr. Jeremy 'Brien to review the feasibility study for the implementation f the solid waste management act.

Mr. Crain, Supervisor-Chairman presented the ttached proposal to Council for their consideration:

A total of nine (9) additional manned private centers. Equipment and engineering for these enters, transfer stations including land and equipment, an inpunty subtitle D landfill if a regional landfill does not rove feasible and closure/post closure of the present acilities.

Mr. Crain did not recommend acceptance of a ertical landfill as it would mean another thirty (30) years of iability in monitoring ground water, additional closure/post losure costs, etc.

The county has bonding capacity of \$12,000,000, owever, it will cost approximately \$20,000,000 to begin this cogram, therefore the funding could be millage, vending fee, a combination of the two.

Mr. Crain reminded Council that the costs quoted in the feasibility study done by HDR Engineering had a variance fights or minus 20% and also that the recommendation he made to buncil did not contain a contingency fund.

Solid Waste age 2 - April 1, 1993

Mr. Stanley McAlister, Chairman of the Solid aste Advisory Commission, stated he felt the commission could upport Mr. Crain's proposal.

Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. rr, approved 5 - 0 that Council go into an executive session or a legal briefing regarding this matter at this time.

Mr. Williams had to leave at this time.

When open session resumed, Mr. Harper made a otion, seconded by Mrs. Burrell, approved 4 - 0 (Mr. Williams bsent) that Mr. Crain's proposal, which did not include the ertical expansion, be adopted.

At the recommendation of Ms. Dillard, Purchasing irector, Mr. Orr made a motion, seconded by Mr. Harper, pproved 4 - 0 (Mr. Williams absent) that the administration be iven the authority to negotiate a contract with HDR to take the raft feasibility study and the county's plan as a base and repare a solid waste management plan to be submitted to SC DHEC or consideration. When this plan is completed, the iministration, Engineer, Solid Waste Director, County Attorney nd Solid Waste Advisory Committee Chairman is to present this lan to DHEC. The cost of preparing this plan is not to exceed 10,000 with the charges being justified by HDR Engineering. he funds for this will come from contingency and this is eing done under the following Sections of Ordinance 85-2, conee County Purchasing Manual": Section C, Subsection 2, "When t is in the advantage of Oconee County to acquire goods and/or ervices on a previously awarded bid or contract" and Subsection , "When in the Purchasing Agent's judgement, and with the oncurrence of Council, it is to the advantage of the county's nterest to do so."

Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mrs. urrell, approved 4 - 0 (Mr. Williams absent) that the Purchasing yent obtain the names of realtors in Oconee County from the pard of Realtors, put them in a hat and draw three (3) names at and from the three, select a consultant to identify specific ites for the manned convenience centers.

Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. rr, approved 4 - 0 (Mr. Williams absent) that prior to the ext Council meeting on April 6, 1993 that HDR Engineering ubmit and justify quotes for the other engineering services or additional engineering services that will be necessary to omply with DHEC regulations. These include the Material ecovery Station, engineer for landfills, engineer for manned enters and a composting facility.

Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. rr, approved 4 - 0 (Mr. Williams absent) that the attached ontract for disposal of infectious waste at the Law Enforceent Center be adopted.

This letter is written on behalf of the Oconee County Solid Waste Advisory Council.

Dear Norman:

We, the members of the OCSWAC, wish to state for the record that we are in complete agreement with the current plan to manage solid waste in Oconee County. The decision to accelerate the construction of the Convenience Centers and rely on this method of collection for the unincorporated areas will ensure that the waste is collected and properly sorted for recovery and/or disposal. The construction of an integrated Transfer/MRF will allow for consolidation and/or further segregation to enhance the county's recovery efforts. If the county is successful in acquiring the current site for the T/MRF, the decision to locate the White Goods, Inert and Composting operations on the Seneca Landfill will also prove to be the Best Management Practice in terms of total control as well as economics. Last the decision to solicit bids from private companies to haul and dispose of the counties waste in a Subtitle D landfill until either an in-county or a regional cooperative can be developed is "right-on-target".



RECOVERY CORPORATION OF NORTH CAROLINA STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Obligations as follows:

a ACNC will cause to be picked up transported, freated by means of incineration and the sah disposed of in a mariner consisters with the artists and federal regulations, all of the Generator's infectious waste as defined below:

"Infectious Waste," as used in this contract will consist of the following: "estation waste, cultures and stocks of infectious agents and associated biologicals, human blood and blood products, pathological waste, contaminated sharps, westes from surgery and autopsy, miscellaneous aboratory waste, disayers unit weste, sperif phermaceuticals, discarded diseetings, and contaminated lineas or disposable linear substitutes. Specifically excluded from the terms "infectious Wastes," as used in the operand; are Human refuses, human carcassas, radiolacooperandear medical fluids, research or productive mycotoxins, heavy metals (mercury), bulk chemicals or reagents, votables, explosives, pressurized containers regardless of contents or properlient whether full or empty. Also excluded are any other terms or metarials not specifically included within the definition of infectious westes set forth above. All Poly Varyi Chloride (PVC) pleasing are excluded.

- RCNC shall pick up all of the Generator's Infectious Wastes according to a schedule agreed upon by the parties in accordance with Generator's needs.
- RCNC shall provide, upon request of Generator, containers for the Generator's use in such quantities as agreed upon its accordance with Generator's
 needs. If Generator desires to purchase containers from a source office then RCNC RCNC will provide the required specifications for any such
 containers.
- 6. RCNC shall provide Generator with instructions relating to its requirements for containerizing Intectious Wastes, including without Ilmitation shale instructions and forther Schedule "A" attached. Notwithstanding enything herein, RCNC shall under no circumstances be responsible for training Generator's employeds, nor shall RCNC be liable for any fallore by Generator to comply with any Federal, State or local laws or regulations.
- Generator specifically agrees that HCNC may subcontract with others for the performance of all or a portion of its responsibilities.

2 Generator's obligations are as follows:

- Generator wit contained and see the intectious Wasts only in containers provided by RCNC or meeting FICNC's Specifications in accordance with FICNC's instructions and epoticable law.
- Senerator agrees to comply with any specified instructions of RCNC as set forth on Schedule "A" (attached), hereto or any written addendum to this compact, and with any Federal. State or local laws and regulations.
- 4 Senerator will have such containers as it wishes to have disposed of sealed and ready to be picked up at the times agreed upon by the parties. If Generator does not have such containers ready. RCNC may charge Generator on additional transportation fee for returning to pick up the containers when they are ready.
- Generator shall place only infectious Waste as defined in this agreement is containers for pick up by FICNO, and shall not place any waste materials
 that have been excluded from that definition in those containers.
- c. For RCNC's services. Generator shall pay RCNC's invoices, net thirty days. Failure to pay invoiced amounts when due shall be a breach of this agreement and will entitle RCNC, as its option, to terminate the agreement, in addition, Generator agreem to pay to RCNC a service charge of 1.5% per month of any behances not paid when one if RCNC deems if necessary to him a collector service or attorney to collect any definquent bislances, Generator agrees to pay all costs of collection, incorping without limitation, reasonable attorney's fees.
- f. Generator agrees to pay the addition of any Taxes. Feel or Charges levied, imposed or incident to the service by requirements imposed by duty authorized regulatory bacters. Federal State or Local having jurisdiction over the handling and disposal of the Wasto for which the service is provided. Such cost will be invoiced to the Generator without markup by PCNC Service Co., Inc.

RCNC's rights relating to inspection and releast of containers.

- a. RCNC shall have the right to refuse acceptance of any containers (i) not meeting its specifications. (ii) not properly filled and seeled in accordance with instructions or (iii) that contains any materials excluded under peregraph. I above, or any material that cannot in RCNC's able judgment be haured, treated or disposed of selely and in accordance with all applicable less and regulations.
- b For purposes of exercising its right under this provision, FCNC shall have the right (but size the obligation) to inspect the contents of any container prior to pick-up. Generator further grants to RCNC the right to inspect its facilities and operations the nature of the materials it disposes of in connection with its business and operations.
- c. Any waste that has been accepted and transported and contains an unacceptable waste listed above in paragraph 1 (a), will be returned to the Generator's expense.

4. Liebilities.

- a. RONC stati not under any discumisances be responsible for any injuries, damage or loss arising from Generator's Intections Wests prior to pack-up by RCNC
- b. Generator horsely agrees to independ and hold RCNC, their successors and assigns, harmless from and against all togs, damage or liability of any nature occurring (including without limitation researched atterney's fees) as a result of (i) Generator's wastes prior to pick-up by RCNC (ii). Generator's inclusion in its containers of waste other than those occurred under this Agreement.

Terms and Termination

a. RINCN may terminate this Agreement for failure of Generator to pay amounts owed translater when due. Furthermore, either party that to comply with other terms and conditions of the Agreement upon the giving of the ty (30) days prior written notice of intent to terminate, which notice shall apportly the nature of such default. The defaulting party shall have the opportunity to cure such certainty within such thirty (30) days, in which exons the Agreement will not terminate.

8. Miscellaneous:

- a. A Waiver of any breach or breaches of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver of breach in any other wateress.
- This Agreement supersones any prior agreement between the parties and constitutes the entire agreement of the parties. This Agreement may
 be amended only by a written agreement signed by the parties.
- a. This Agreement shall be governed by and continued in accordance with the caws of the County of Mackinstong and State of North Carolina. The parties agree that the Venue for purposes of any tegel action commanded hereunder alias be in the State of North Carolina.
- c. If any litigation arises between the parties concerning this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the other party its costs and responsible adversely's tess incurred in connection therewith.
- e. Items beyond Company's corrol, such as disposal charges, liability insurance costs, takes, included fuel waters and fuel costs are a significant portion of the cost of service. Therefore, the Company may increase the unit price of the cost of services provided in an amount equal to any equivalent cost increases in such disposal, insurance or fuel costs.

7. Force Majoure:

The performance of this agreement may be suspended and the obligations thereusider excussed in the event and during the period that such performance is prevented by a cause or causes beyond the reasonable control of PCNC or it subcommothers.

The parties have signed and sesiad this Agreement as of the date written.
