MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Oconee County Council was held Tuesday, January 17, 1995 at 3:00 pm in Council Chambers with all Council Members present and the County Attorney present.

Members of the press notified (by mail): Journal/Tribune, Keowee Courier, Westminster News, Anderson Independent, Greenville News, WGOG Radio, WBFM Radio, WCCP Radio, WZLI/WLET Radio, WYFF TV, WLOS TV & SC Black Media Group.

Press

Members of the press present: Ashton Hester - Keowee Courier, Dick Mangrum - WGOG Radio & Jennifer Barnett -Anderson Independent.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor Call to Order -Chairman Crain who welcomed the quests and media.

The invocation was given by Mr. Orr.

Invocation

Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Burrell, approved 5 - 0 that the minutes of the regular meeting held January 3, 1995 be adopted as printed.

Minutes (1/3/95)

Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Minutes Orr, approved 5 - 0 that the minutes of the special meeting held (12/29/94) December 29, 1994 be adopted as printed.

Before the vote was cast on the minutes, Mr. Cain, County Attorney, stated he would like for the minutes to reflect that he is writing the contract between the Oconee County Sewer Commission and ENVIROFAB for the purchase of a sludge drying machine to try to protect the commission against liens.

At the request of Mr. Robert Gaillard, Planning Director & Mr. Robert Winchester, Sewer Commission Director, Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - 0 that the County apply for an ARC Grant and a CDBG Grant in the amount of \$987,750 for a sewer line along Richland Creek due to the expansion of the Kendall Company. There are no local match funds involved with these grants.

Sewer Grant

At the request of Mr. Robert Gaillard, Planning Director, Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Burrell, approved 5 - 0 that the County apply for a Coordinating Council Grant in the amount of \$21,000 for an entry way into the Slumberger plant. There are no local funds involved in this grant.

Slumberger Grant

Upon request of Mr. R. Daniel Day, Attorney, Mrs. Burrell made a motion, seconded by Mr. Orr, approved 5 - 0 that the County Attorney present the request of Mr. Day's client for the County to abandon, close and terminate maintenance on a portion of County Roadway WA 35 (Vaughn Lee Road) with the property owner constructing a cul-de-sac at the point of abandonment to the Master-in-Equity and leave it to the discretion of the court to determine the best interest of all property owners involved.

Tornado Grant

Mr. Alan Horn, Emergency Preparedness Director, briefed Council regarding the status of the CDBG grant to assist persons affected by the tornado. Of the thirty-two (32) applications received, thirteen (13) families or individuals qualified for assistance. As of this date eleven (11) families have been given assistance with two (2) applications pending. There have been three (3) mobile homes provided, two (2) mobile homes are pending, the set up of eight (8) mobile homes has been provided with two (2) set ups pending, one (1) modular home has been provided, one (1) home has been repaired and there a four (4) mortgage assistance payments pending.

There is an excess of an estimated \$116,000 in the grant and at the request of Mr. Horn, Mr. Orr made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - 0 that a request for a waiver be made and the families that most closely meet the low to moderate income guidelines be given assistance from the grant.

Upon request of Ms. Sundie Stone of the Rosa Clark Clinic, Mr. Orr made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - 0 that the Council endorse an "Oconee County AIDS Awareness Night".

Rosa Clark

PRT

At the request of Mr. Alex James, PRT Director, Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Orr, approved 5 - 0 that PRT be allowed to apply for a PARD Grant in the amount of \$15,000. This is an 80 - 20 match grant, part of the match is in the PRT budget and the remainder of the match will be in labor.

Also at the request of Mr. James, Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 5 - 0 that the PRT Commission be allowed to apply for Land and Water Conservation Funds in the amount of \$25,000 for a bridge and trail construction project. Mr. James stated they would use SC Trails Fund Grant as the matching portion of this grant.

Mr. James & Ms. Marianne Dillard, Purchasing Director, informed Council that removal of timber at the South Cove & High Falls Parks had been bid the second time as requested by Council.

Page 3 January 17, 1995

There were no bids received that met specifications, however, the Purchasing Department had received one (1) quote to remove the timber at South Cove paying the County \$1,427 and removing the timber at High Falls paying the County \$1,238 from Riggins Logging.

Ms. Dillard informed Council that Mr. Riggins did not attend the site visit, the bid was not on the proper form, he had \$300,000 liability rather than the requested \$500,000, he does not have worker's compensation and he has no performance bond.

Mr. Cain, County Attorney, expressed concerns that the company did not have worker's compensation and if someone got hurt the courts could possibly construe them to be employees of Oconee County.

Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - 0 that the bid for the removal of the timber be rejected and the removal of the timber at South Cove be bid one more time using the same criteria as before and also that it be advertised in the Westminster News.

Upon recommendation of Mr. Lee Davis, Motor Pool Foreman, Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Strickland, approved 5 - 0 that the attached proposed Parts Purchase Order Configuration for the Motor Pool be adopted.

Motor Pool

Upon recommendation of Mr. Davis, Mrs. Burrell made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 3 - 2 (Mr. Strickland & Mr. Orr voting against) that the bid for oil products for the Motor Pool be awarded to Lowry Oil Co. who was low bid overall as per the attached bid sheet.

Ms. Dillard informed Council that only one (1) bid for tires for County vehicles and equipment had been received, therefore, Mr. Orr made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 5 - 0 that the tires be rebid and the time frame be for a six (6) month period rather than for a year.

Mr. Jim Smith, Public Buildings Director, informed Council there were problems with the septic tank at the Oconee County Animal Shelter. Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Orr, approved 5 - 0 that Mr. Smith transfer funds and repair/replace the tank should a further malfunction occur.

Animal Shelter

Upon recommendation of Mr. Jack Hirst, Solid Waste Director, and Ms. Dillard, Purchasing Director, Mr. Orr made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Burrell, approved 5 - 0 that the manned convenience centers Package A (Metromont, Pine Grove

& Salem Sites) and Package B (Richland & Mt. Rest Sites) be adopted on the terms delineated in the attached letters from HDR Engineering, Inc.

Mr. Hirst also informed Council that he anticipated giving a two (2) weeks notice that the green box sites would be closed by having Mr. Hawk place signs at the sites advising of the closing date.

Mr. Crain informed Council that Southern Bell was willing to donate to the County a Dictaphone Recorder that once used in the Pickens County 911 system. This machine is still under warranty, Southern Bell will transport it to the City of Seneca, install it, and for a fee, maintain it. Pickens County has approximately sixty (60) tapes for the machine.

Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Burrell, approved 5 - 0 that Oconee County accept the machine and request to purchase the tapes from Pickens County.

Mr. Orr, Chairman of the Roads & Transportation Committee, informed Council it was the recommendation of the committee that the following road names be changed:

State Park Rd. to Highway 107

Winding Stairs to Cheohee Rd.

Burrell Cemetery to Cherry Hill Cemetery

Big Ben to Big Bend

Tower Rd. to Station Mt. Rd.

State Park Rd. be the roadway into the park

This recommendation was unanimously adopted.

Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Orr, approved 5 - 0 that the fee for changing the road signs be waived.

Mr. Orr made a motion, seconded by Mr. Strickland, approved 5 - 0 that Mr. H. D. Pinion be extended credit at the Rock Crusher as per Ordinance 91-10.

Mr. Orr made a motion, seconded by Mr. Strickland, approved 5 - 0 that Oconee County withdraw its membership from the Metropolitan Arts Council.

Mr. Orr made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - 0 that the County Attorney prepare a resolution to be sent to the SC Congressional Delegation urging them to keep the Fish Hatchery in Oconee County open.

Mr. Cain informed Council that the Sewer Commission wanted the language stating the County could obtain sludge from the Sewer Commission if needed in the research component at the subtitle "D" landfill taken out of the contract to purchase the sludge drying machine.

Sewer Commission

Council agreed that the County should keep that option.

Mr. Cain also informed Council that the attorneys for Eagle Ridge had requested a meeting to discuss the consent order and documents regarding Eagle Ridge with the Chief Administrative Judge. Mr. Cain further informed Council that the meeting might be Wednesday, January 18, 1995, but he did know if Mr. Saleeby, Department of Commerce, Division of Aeronautics would be there.

Eagle Ridge

Mr. Crain requested that a briefing by Mr. Walter Wulff regarding the safety of the Oconee County Airport with and without the operation of the Eagle Ridge Airport presented in executive session September 14, 1993 be made available to the Chief Executive Judge. After considerable discussion, Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, defeated 3 - 2 (Mr. Orr, Mr. Williams & Mrs. Burrell voting against, Mr. Strickland & Mr. Hamilton voting for) that the report be made available to the Judge.

Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 5 - 0 that the keys to the Lunney Museum for the burglar system be given to Ms. Nancy Clayton.

Lunney Museum

Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton that the County renew its option on three hundred, twelve (312) acres of land for an in county subtitle "D" landfill if the regional landfill does not materialize.

Option on

Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Executive Orr, approved 5 - 0 that the above motion be tabled and Council go into executive session to discuss contractual matters.

Session

When open session resumed, the vote to renew Open the option was defeated 3 - 2 (Mr. Orr, Mr. Williams & Mrs. Session Burrell voting against, Mr. Strickland & Mr. Hamilton voting for).

Mr. Crain reminded Council of outstanding committee assignments as per attached listing.

Mr. Crain assigned to the Purchasing, Contracting, Real Estate, Building & Grounds Committee repair problems at the courthouse, he also asked the committee to make a recommendation to Council regarding the need to renew the lease on the Blue Ridge Electric Building in Westminster, needed office space and locating a site for a manned convenience center north of West Union.

Upon recommendation of Mr. Crain, Mr. Orr made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 5 - 0 that another \$26,800 for repair of roadways be added to Federal Grant Contract Oconee WPEA #8 from line item 10 022 00150 22881.

The Personnel & Intergovernmental Committee scheduled a meeting Tuesday, February 7, 1995 at 6:00 pm for the Meetings purpose of discussing the Land Use Plan, the Height Restriction Ordinance & the Planning Commission Ordinance.

The Purchasing, Contracting, Real Estate, Building & Grounds Committee scheduled a meeting Wednesday, February 1, 1995 at 8:00 am for the purpose of discussing needed office space and other matters relating to public buildings.

Dear Mr. Crain:

The purpose of this letter is to recommend that the County take occupancy of the three staffed convenience centers in Package A (Metromont, Pine Grove, and Salem Sites).

The following is a brief summary of the recent past activities regarding the project and the issues remaining to fully close out the contracts.

HDR performed a final inspection on November 21, 1994, and related punch list correction items to Zorn Company, Inc. under letter dated December 6, 1994. Zorn Company, Inc. indicated via letter dated January 5, 1995, that the punch list items had been completed as of December 28, 1994.

- There have been concerns over the stability of the gravel parking lots. Mr. Hirst of your staff has operated vehicles at each site to verify that they are acceptable at this time.
- As you know, by joint agreement we have deferred the paving of the Metromont and Salem Sites until a time mutually agreed to, anticipated to be in the spring or early summer of 1995.

HDR recommends that the County take occupancy of the sites and open the sites to the public at which time you choose. HDR continues to complete the final contractual paperwork as indicated below.

• HDR will execute a change order which will address changes that have been made to the site by Zorn Company which were improvements to the sites, including some drainage work at Salem, extending a driveway at Metromont, running the phone service underground at each site, and modifying the site lighting at Salem. HDR will prepare and execute a change order for these items for the contractor's and County's signature.

- Zorn Company, Inc. will prepare the Final Partial Pay Request indicating
 that the County will hold 120 percent of the paving cost of Metromont and
 Salem Sites. As stated above, at a time mutually agreed to by all parties,
 Zorn will proceed with the paving of the Metromont and Salem Sites and
 will be paid the balance of their contract.
- The one-year warranty period will expire December 28, 1995, which coincides with the letter received from Zorn indicating that the punch list items were completed on December 28, 1994.
- The one-year warranty period for the paving at the Metromont and Salem Sites will extend one year from the date of acceptance of the paving.
- As mutually agreed between HDR Engineering and Zorn Company, in the
 event the gravel parking areas become a serious problem over the next few
 months indicating poor performance on Zorn's part, we will meet to discuss
 necessary actions and Zorn will make necessary improvements. Oconee
 County will be responsible for normal wear and tear of the sites during the
 interim period before the sites are paved.

We appreciate the opportunity to provide services to the County and look forward to the opening of the first three convenience center sites. If you have any questions regarding this information, please contact me.

Dear Mr. Crain:

The purpose of this letter is to bring you up to date on the current activities regarding Package B of the Staffed Convenience Centers and to advise you on the probable completion dates for the Richland and Mountain Rest sites.

The Mountain Rest site is substantially complete and as of January 12 all that remained was to place mulch in some areas. Per our agreement, Justice will pave the Mountain Rest site when weather conditions are more appropriate.

As you know, some of the areas of the paved parking lot at the Richland site do not drain properly. Also, some of the removable handrails sections were difficult to take out because the pipe sleeves Justice used were too small in diameter. We have worked jointly with Justice to resolve both problems in the following way:

- Justice will pour a new concrete curb at the retaining wall which will increase the height of the curb to allow additional pavement to be placed which will direct the water away from the wall as originally intended. The new curb will have new larger pipe sleeves to facilitate removal of the removable handrail.
- Justice will install two temporary area drains in the two low spots of the asphalt which at this time retain water.
- Justice will come back when weather conditions are favorable and place the additional asphalt required to make the drainage right, at which time the temporary drains will be paved over.

Justice is proceeding with placement of the new curb and installation of the area drains. We anticipate that this work will be completed prior to your next council meeting and HDR will prepare a letter recommending the County takes occupancy of both the Mountain Rest and Richland sites prior to the next Council meeting. At a time agreed to by all parties (expected to be late spring or early summer) Justice will pave the Mountain Rest site and place the additional pavement at the Richland site.

The additional paving and placement of the curb at the Richland site will be done at no additional cost to the contract. As with Package A, we will retain 120 percent of the paving cost on Justice's contract with the additional monies being paid after the pavement has been accepted.

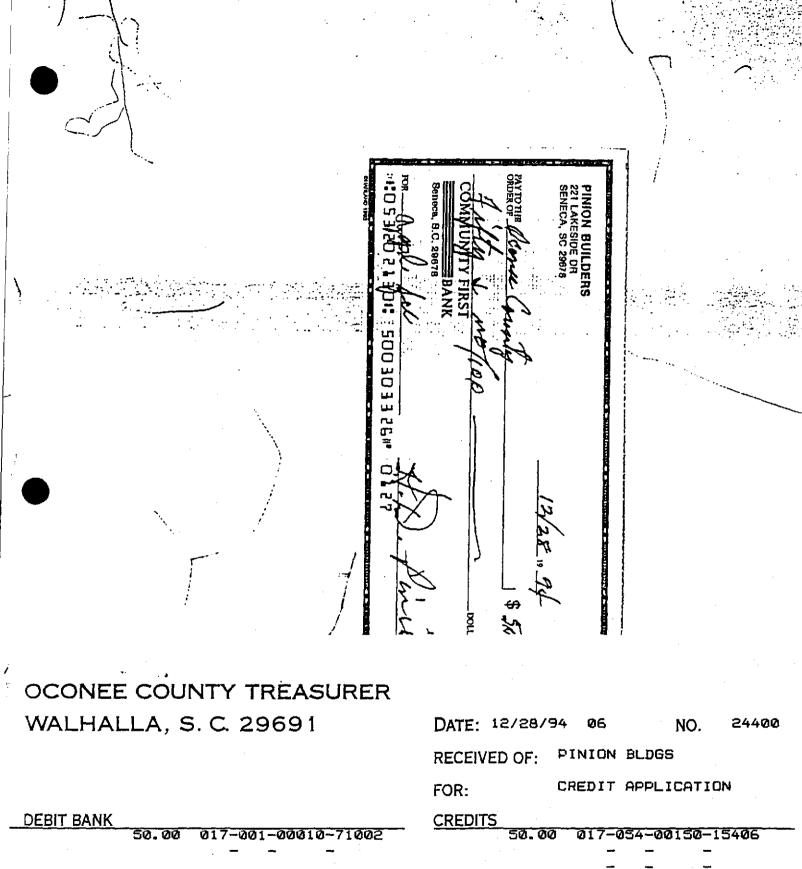
