#### MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The regularly scheduled meeting of the Oconee County Council was held Tuesday, October 15, 1996 at 3:00 pm in Council Chambers with all Council Members except Ms. Burrell present. The County Attorney was also present.

Members of the press notified (by mail): Journal/Tribune, Keowee Courier, Westminster News, Anderson Independent, Greenville News, WGOG Radio, WBFM Radio, WCCP Radio, WYFF TV & WLOS TV.

Members of the press present: Ashton Hester - Keowee Courier & Dick Mangrum - WGOG Radio.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor-Chairman Crain who welcomed the guests and media.

The invocation was given by Mr. Williams.

Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that the minutes of the regular meeting held October 1, 1996 be adopted as printed.

First on the agenda was a public hearing to receive written and/or oral comments regarding the lease by Oconee County of approximately thirty-five (35) acres of cultivated land owned by Oconee County and located in or near the Five Forks Community. The lease is to become effective January 1, 1997.

There was no one present with written and/or oral comments regarding the lease of this land.

Upon request of Mr. Robert Gaillard, Economic Development Director, & Mr. Robert Winchester, Sewer Commission Superintendent, Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that the county apply for a Budget & Control Board grant in the amount of \$5,700 for a sewer line to service the Nason Company. There are no county funds involved in this grant.

Upon request of Mrs. Martha Baily, Library Director, Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Orr, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that the county apply for an LSCA Grant for tuition for a library employee enrolled in a Master Science Program and the employee sign a sub-recepient agreement to repay the county should the county have to pay the grant funds back.

Upon request of Mr. Lee Davis, Motor Pool Foreman, Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Williams, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that up to \$6,000 be taken from contingency and placed in line item 10 012 00150 00840 to purchase tanks to store bulk oil. This will save the county a great deal of money and the oil will meet specifications for the vehicles in which it is used.

Upon recommendation of Mr. Davis & Ms. Dillard, Purchasing Agent, Mr. Strickland made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that the bid for police tires (Group A) be awarded to Goodyear Tire & Rubber Co. who was low bid at \$31,420.36 and the bid for light duty tires (Group B), heavy duty tires (Group C), tires for mowers and small tractors (Group D) and tire tubes (Group E) be awarded to W. N. Watson Supply Co. who was low bid at \$143,219. 72. (See attached bid sheet)

Upon recommendation of Mrs. Sallie Smith, Clerk of Court & Ms. Dillard, Mr. Williams made a motion, seconded by Mr. Strickland, approved 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that the bid for a copying machine for the Clerk of Court's office be awarded to Kern's Corporation at a cost of \$3,814.95. Ms. Matheson withdrew her request to address Council regarding the Long Creek manned convenience center.

Upon recommendation of the Purchasing, Contracting, Real Estate, Building & Grounds Committee, Council voted 4 - 0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that the manned convenience center for the Long Creek area be placed on Unity Church Road, that Mr. Hawk secure an option on the tract of land, have it surveyed and bring it back to Council for approval.

Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mr. Strickland, approved 4-0 (Ms. Burrell absent) that Council go into executive session for the purpose of discussing legal and personnel matters.

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT A LOCAL COMPREHENSIVE LAND USE PLAN FOR OCONEE COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA.

WHEREAS, Title 6, Chapter 29 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina authorizes a local government to develop and maintain a local comprehensive plan containing those elements considered critical, necessary and desirable to guide the development and redevelopment within its area of jurisdiction; and,

WHEREAS, the Oconee County Planning Commission has recommended for adoption to the County Council for Oconee County a comprehensive plan,

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the County Council of the County of Oconee, in session, duly assembled, with a quorum present and voting:

Section 1. TITLE: This ordinance shall be known and may be cited as "OCONEE COUNTY ORDINANCE 96-\_\_\_\_, AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT A LOCAL COMPREHENSIVE LAND USE PLAN FOR OCONEE COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA."

Section 2. COMPREHENSIVE PLAN ADOPTED: The County Council for the County of Oconee hereby adopts for the unincorporated areas of Oconee County, South Carolina as a comprehensive plan for Oconee County, South Carolina the "1996 Land Use Plan" dated February, 1996 attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference as if restated verbatim.

RE: Oil Products

The current bid we have for oil expires on September 22, 1996. Upon several conversations with the current bid holder and other vendors the County could save a great deal of money by purchasing oil in bulk. We do not currently have bulk tanks to contain the oil. The options we have are bidding out the oil in such a manner that the bid price includes the vendor supplying the tanks, which includes the hoses, reels, and air operated pumps or the county purchasing the tanks. I have received a rough estimated price of around \$1,800.00 per tank to purchase. For an additional cost of around \$1000.00 two tanks can be linked up with the Fuelmaster system allowing the oil to be dispensed and charged just like the gas and diesel are now. The prices quoted were for 275 gallon tanks. A 275 gallon tank can be housed inside the Motor Pool, because they will not take up much more space than two 55 gallon drums.

In comparing the price per quart of oil in a plastic container verses the bulk system the price per quart will be approximately half of what we are paying now. I did a comparison between the amount of Amoco 300 and Havoline 10W40 that we have purchased during the last fiscal year, we could save \$4,396.28 per year. This savings would more than pay for the cost of the tanks if they were to be purchased.

It would be much easier on the department to use the bulk system. We are losing a lot of good oil that is still left in the plastic container, then the plastic containers take up a great deal of space in the shop while they are being drained, then they have to be disposed of in the landfill as the containers would have to be washed and clean in order to be recycled. The reels would be mounted overhead so any bay area in the shop could access the hoses. I realize that we will have to maintain a few cases of the quarts to charge out to departments to fill vehicles on the road.

We would appreciate your consideration into these possibilities. This would be much easier on the department as well as a large saving to the County.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY GROUND AND SURFACE WATER ASSESSMENT OF LANDFILLS PRESENTED BY GOLDIE & ASSOCIATES, INC.

## INTRODUCTION

As required by two letters from the SC DHEC dated December 1, 1993 and December 8, 1993, Oconee County must develop an Assessment Plan for the Five Points and Seneca Landfills. These plans are due to DHEC by February 28 and March 30, 1994, respectfully.

We at Goldie & Associates were retained by the County as approved during the January 4, 1994 County Council Meeting to prepare the plans. During the past six weeks we have been preparing the plans and have evaluated the Probable Costs associated with conducting the work that will be in the plans.

Because substantial costs will be involved in conducting the Plans, we felt the need to inform the County of these costs and the associated work before we commit the County in writing. This is the reason why we are here today.

## TECHNICAL DESCRIPTION OF PROBLEM

The factors that have triggered DHEC's requirement of the Plans at this point in time is the detection of several synthetic (manmade) compounds in ground water monitoring wells at both landfills.

At the Five Points Landfill, compounds including the following have been detected at the following concentrations in one of the two downgradient wells:

Because some local residents still use ground water as a source of drinking water, particularly in the Five Points community, and because these compounds have been detected at concentrations exceeding the Maximum Contaminant Levels (MCLs) set by EPA, SC DHEC requires that the County develop a Plan that will "determine the nature and extent of groundwater contamination at the landfill."

## ASSESSMENT PLAN

We propose to adopt a phased approach to assessing both sites so that information can be gathered and evaluated before proceeding to the next phase. The phases and their Probable Costs are presented on the following pages. This is neither a cost estimate nor a proposal. It is an Opinion of Probable Cost at this point in time and could change depending upon how DHEC responds to the Plan and what is discovered during the course of the work. Although we feel that DHEC will accept the Plan, we can not guarantee that they will not require additional measures besides those that we have outlined below.

#### PHASE I: FIELD SCREENING

Summary

This phase will involve drilling of several hydropunch borings with preliminary testing of ground water. The hydropunch is a steel tube that is driven into the ground at specified depths. The tube is configured with ball valves such that it allows groundwater to collect in the interior of the tube. The tube is then removed from the ground and the water is transferred to sample containers.

The samples are analyzed using screening techniques which provide quicker analysis results at less cost. No permanent wells will be installed in this phase, nor will certified analysis be conducted since this is just a field screening method to develop a "picture of the site."

The range in costs below reflects the uncertainty of conditions at the site. The number of borings and samples that will be conducted will be developed based on field conditions as the assessment is progressing. If no significant spread of ground water impact is found then the number of borings and samples will be probably be low. However, if significant ground water impact is found, then there will be a great deal of sampling and analysis.

In addition the range in cost is also a reflection of the uncertainty of how deep the borings will have to be drilled since drilling rates are based on a per foot basis.

## PHASE II: SAPROLITE WELLS

Summary

This phase will involve the drilling and installation of cluster monitoring wells. SC DHEC will require that additional wells be installed to monitor the ground water impact at the landfill. However, we will want to minimize the number of wells since the County will have to sample and analyze the ground water from each permanent well installed for the next 30 years during Post Closure.

The number of wells to be installed during this phase could vary significantly depending upon the results of Phase I. However, for Probable Cost purposes, we have estimated that up to four sets of cluster wells will be installed.

Cluster wells are wells that sample multiple points. The wells that would be used for the Landfill work will sample two points - the water table and the bottom of the saprolite aguifer.

In the upstate, we have two types of aquifers. The Saprolite Aquifer and the Bedrock Aquifer. The Saprolite Aquifer is shallow and is the aquifer that resides in the soil. This aquifer is bounded on the bottom by non-porous bedrock. The non-porous bedrock has a smaller aquifer limited to fractures in the bedrock.

The concern regarding the landfills and the chemicals detected is that these chemicals have densities greater than water. In other words, if you were to mix pure chemical with water, shake it up and then let it settle, the chemical would "sink" to the bottom of the container. The same happens in ground water where the heavy chemicals, if in high enough concentration, "sink" to the bottom of the aquifer. This is the reason why the State is interested in cluster wells being installed that both sample the top and bottom of the aquifer.

## PHASE III: BEDROCK WELLS

Summary

This phase will involve the drilling of bedrock wells at the landfill sites. The number of wells to be installed will depend upon the results of the Phase I work.

Bedrock wells are generally deep wells that most people use for water consumption since they yield more water than Saprolite wells (bored or hand dug). The purpose of the bedrock wells will be to monitor the bedrock aguifer.

On June 18, 1996, Oconee County held a public hearing to inform the citizens of Oconee County as to the results of an assessment of needs relating to community development, housing, and economic development. The County identified the need to rehabilitate substandard housing, especially those that are occupied by low and moderate income persons, as one of the needs. This HOME project is being proposed in order to address this need.

The County is proposing to rehabilitate 7 substandard owner-occupied houses, with an average rehabilitation cost of \$29,643. This figure was arrived at through discussions with the housing rehabilitation expert at the Appalachian Council of Governments based on his experience with the cost of rehabilitation on the type and condition of houses Oconee County anticipates addressing. The funding sources are the HOME program funds at \$200,000 and \$7,501 committed by the Oconee County Council at its meeting of August 6, 1996.

Oconee County has received, and successfully completed, numerous federally funded projects. While not technically classified as a "housing project", a \$500,000 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) project was successfully undertaken in 1994-1995 to repair houses damaged in the March 1994 tornado. In addition, Oconee County has received numerous CDBG awards for various projects including a new senior center and a free medical clinic for the indigent. The County has also received CDBG funds and other federal grant funds including Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC), Rural Economic and Community Development (RECD), and Economic Development Administration (EDA) to undertake numerous economic development related projects. All project have been undertaken and completed successfully and with no audit or monitoring problems.

Oconee County usually contracts with the Appalachian Council of Governments (ACOG) to administer its federal grants. However, Oconee County contracted with Carolina Community Resources (CCR) to administer the tornado grant because the ACOG indicated that their housing rehab staff was already committed to other projects and could not devote sufficient time to undertake the project in a reasonable time frame. The County contracted with CCR because their response to a Request for Proposals was submitted which indicated that CCR had the capability to administer all aspects of the grant program from start to finish. In deed, the project was completed within the original grant period and without any problems.

If the HOME grant is awarded to Oconee County, the County will again request the ACOG to administer the project. If the staff at ACOG is not able to undertake the HOME project at that time, the County will advertise for a qualified, experienced consulting firm that can undertake all aspects of the project and meet all federal and state regulations.

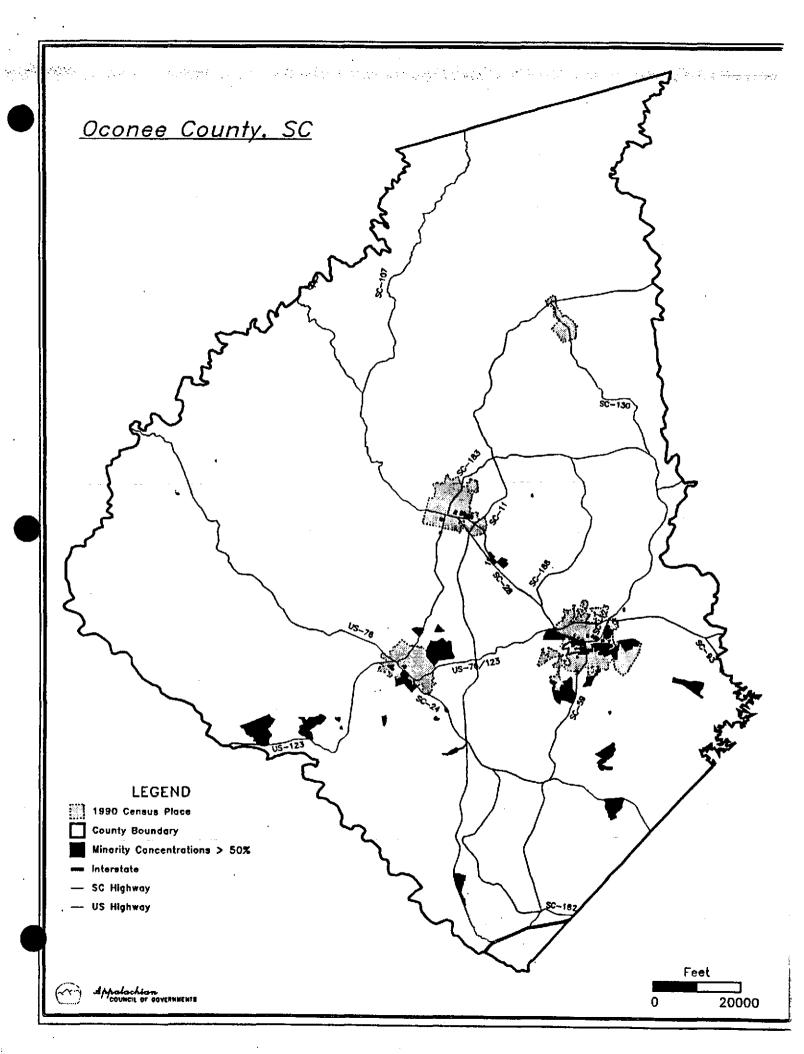
#### MARKETING PLAN

Oconee County has not yet selected or identified specific beneficiaries because it was felt that there was not adequate time to properly advertise and market the project and to obtain a sufficient pool of truly needy households.

Once the grant is funded, Oconee County will publicize the project in the local newspapers and through other means such as the area agency on aging, the county social service agencies, churches, etc. The newspaper article and other grant announcement brochures will contain information on how to apply for assistance and will detail the criteria to be used to determine who may qualify to receive HOME assistance. This will include the following eligibility criteria:

- limited to owner-occupants only
- limited to households whose income is below 50% of the median income for Oconee County
- preference will be given to the elderly and single-parent households

Oconee County will appoint a HOME housing review committee to review applications and to approve/disapprove assistance to the applicants. The decision on who will receive funding will be made based on the above criteria and on the need of the applicant. Such other factors as lack of indoor plumbing, severe overcrowding, the income of the applicant, whether the applicant is handicapped, and the age of the applicant will also be taken into consideration when determining the relative need for HOME assistance. The decisions on who will receive funding will be made without regard to race or nationality.

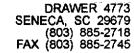
