MINUTES, OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING

The Oconee County Council met Tuesday, February 15, 2000 at 3:00 PM in Council Chambers, 415 South Pine Street, Walhalla, SC with all Council Members and the County Attorney present.

Press:

Members of the press notified (by mail): Journal Tribune, Keowee Courier, Westminster News, Anderson Independent, Greenville News, WGOG Radio, WSNW Radio, WCCP Radio, WPEK Radio, The Times Upstate, WYFF TV, WLOS TV & WSPA TV.

Members of the press present: Dick Mangrum – WGOG Radio, Katherine Wise – Journal/Tribune, & Dave Williams – Anderson Independent.

Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor-Chairman Orr who welcomed the guests and media.

Invocation:

The invocation was given by Mr. Hall.

Public Comment Session:

Mr. B. J. Littleton brought to the attention of Council that Keowee Key residents are applying for private swimming locales and urged Council to go on record objecting them receiving permission for this. Mr. Littleton also expressed feelings that the fire trucks should not be purchased at this time.

Ms. Maxie Duke expressed appreciation to Council for the approval of the ATAX Grant to the Sesquicentennial Committee.

Minutes:

Mr. Thomas made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hughes approved 5-0 that the minutes of the regular meeting held February 1, 2000 be adopted as printed.

ATAX Grant:

Upon recommendation of Mr. Jack Bishop, ATAX Committee, Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 5-0 that the attached ATAX Grant in the amount of \$24,800 to the Walhalla Auditorium Restoration Committee be adopted.

Probation & Parole:

Ms. Lucy Murr, Probation & Parole, presented Council with a year end summary of her office's activities. Mr. Murr informed Council that the mission of Probation & Parole is: 1) Watch; 2) Guide and 3) Enforcement.

Ms. Murr further informed Council they have electronic monitoring for their clients; do drug testing, have a litter program; and offenders pay a \$20.00 fee. They have ten weeks of court per year and hope to become C-1 Officers which would allow them to make arrests.

Law Enforcement Center:

Upon request of Captain Terry Wilson, Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mr. Thomas, approved 5-0 that the attached Line Item Budget Description Change in the total amount of \$15,400 in line item 010 074 00150 00850 (LEC) be adopted.

Further, upon request of Captain Wilson, Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hughes, approved 5-0 that \$2,800 be taken from contingency and placed in the Law Enforcement Center overtime line item for the remainder of this fiscal year.

Upon recommendation of Captain Wilson and Ms. Marianne Dillard, Purchasing Agent, Mr. Thomas made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hughes, approved 5 – 0 that the bid for prescription drugs for LEC be awarded to Winn-Dixie Pharmacy who was the only responsive responsible bidder at a cost of \$1.00 AWP. This bid is for one year with option to renew for four additional years. (See attached bid sheet)

Solid Waste:

Upon recommendation of Mr. Jack Hirst, Solid Waste Director and Ms. Dillard, Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mr. Thomas, approved 5-0 that the bid for containers for Solid Waste be awarded to Municipal Waste Management, LLC who was low bid at \$50,611.20. (See attached bid sheet)

Rural Fire:

Mr. Dewitt Mize, Rural Fire Marshal & Mr. Bobby Williams of the Rural Fire Commission addressed Council regarding including \$143,760 in Ordinance 2000-02, "THE 1999-2000 SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS ORDINANCE" to be used in the purchase of two fire trucks. After considerable discussion, Mr. Orr referred this matter to the Budget & Finance Committee.

Mr. Thomas stated that before the bids are awarded on the fire trucks, he would like to give the Rural Fire Commission an opportunity to voice whether they would like the bids to be awarded as per the speculations or if they would like to have a top mount truck at Fairplay and a four wheel drive truck at Mountain Rest with the communities raising the additional funds.

Law Enforcement, Safety, Health, Welfare & Services Committee Meeting:

The Law Enforcement, Safety, Health, Welfare & services Committee scheduled a meeting Thursday, February 17, 2000 at 3:30 PM for the purpose of discussing the above referenced matter and a meeting Thursday, February 24, 2000 at 1:00 PM for the purpose of discussing sewer in the county.

Ordinance 2000-02:

Mr. Hamilton made a motion, seconded by Mr. Thomas, approved 5-0 that Ordinance 2000-02, "THE 1999-2000 SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS ORDINANCE" be adopted on second reading.

Ordinance 2000-03:

Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hughes, approved 5-0 that Ordinance 2000-03, "OCONEE COUNTY ANIMAL CONTROL ORDINANCE" be adopted on first reading in title only.

Humane Society Agreement:

Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mr. Thomas, approved 5-0 that the attached agreement between Oconee County and the Humane Society be adopted.

Tourism Committee:

Mr. Hall made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton that all Council Members have their appointees made to the Tourism Committee at the next Council Meeting and they have an organizational meeting March 9, 2000 at 6:00 PM.

<u>Purchasing, Contracting, Real Estate, Building & Grounds Committee</u> Recommendation:

Mr. Thomas, Chair, Purchasing, Contracting, Real Estate, Building & Grounds Committee informed Council it was the recommendation of the committee that the county install lighting at a cost of \$5,000 in the Salem Library and the county pay the entire electrical costs in exchange for county personnel not having to clean that facility. This recommendation was adopted 5-0.

Tourism Committee:

Mrs. Hughes made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, approved 5-0 that Mr. Scott Butts be appointed to represent District IV on the Tourism Committee:

Road Foreman:

Mrs. Hughes made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hall, approved 5-0 that she be permitted to secure the services of the Road Foreman on the weekends to look at roadways under Section 13 of the "OCONEE COUNTY BUDGET ORDINANCE": "Should it be necessary for any County Official to engage in travel upon and in the furtherance of County business, not provided for in the budget of such official's department, such travel shall be authorized only by the approval of Oconee County Council. No County equipment or property shall be used for the benefit of any private person, firm or corporation except as may be specifically authorized by appropriate Ordinance of Oconee County Council."

Purchasing, Contracting, Real Estate, Building & Grounds Committee Recommendations:

Mr. Thomas, Chair, Purchasing, Contracting, Real Estate, Building & Grounds Committee informed Council it was the recommendation of the committee that the county seek proposals for an eight foot cover over the walkway simultaneously with proposals for the entrance into the Tax Center and funds for these projects be taken from contingency. However, after discussion, this matter was deferred until the committee meets again.

Mr. Thomas informed Council it was the recommendation of the committee that he be allowed to renegotiate the agreement with Cresent Land & Timber for Fall Creek and Town Creek Landing Parks.

Mr. Thomas further informed Council it was the recommendation of the committee that all the Purchasing, Contracting, Real Estate, Building & Grounds Committee be involved in the completion of the Pine Street Administrative Offices.

Law Enforcement, Safety, Health, Welfare & Services Meeting:

The Walhalla Auditorium when restored will promote tourism in many and various ways. We suggest a few:

The auditorium will be marketed across the state and in neighboring states as a meeting and convention site.

The Southeastern Federation of Gems and Mineral Societies often put on gem shows in the area. We have a large number of members in the region who would be glad to host a show in our 400 seat auditorium.

Specialized antique shows and auctions can be held in the auditorium and will draw crowds from 100's of miles around. This idea is very much a reality since we have 12 or 14 antique shops here in Walhalla. These people have ties with dealers in Highlands and many other areas in the southeast.

The Wagner Society of Walhalla supports classical musical events of all kinds and have ties to many classical groups in the southeast especially who would welcome a small auditorium for their performances. I have spoken personally to members of the Wagner Society concerning this. As a part of this, chamber musicians from Atlanta, Highlands, Greenville, Spartanburg, Charlotte, Brevard and Columbia can be invited to perform. These groups have quite a large following.

Visiting artists such as Piccolo Spoleto from Charleston will be most interested in a facility such as ours. Charleston and Walhalla have 150 years of close connection which we hope to revive.

This will be a perfect place for political rallies. Small conventions which send delegates may be held there.

The Home Builders Association will be able to host vendors and builders from the tristate and upstate areas.

The Realtors Association can invite developers, legislators and Chamber of Commerce people from throughout the state and neighboring states to convene here and enjoy our beautiful Blue Ridge Mountains.

Bankers, Credit Unions, Bar, Medical and Teacher Associations will want to use this facility.

It will be a perfect venue for small touring play-groups, for Blue Grass Bands, Gospel Singers, and for small dance companies.

Every small college around here needs a venue to present their talent and as a result will draw audiences from their area.

Counties around us including those in Georgia and in western North Carolina have no venue such as we plan to provide. Craft shows from the entire southeast will be welcomed. These shows certainly draw from miles around.

To improve tourism in this area some entertainment should be provided for the evening hours as well as the day hours. This auditorium will help to provide this entertainment and be a positive force in the wise and careful development of this area.

Grant Proposal

Walhalla Auditorium Restoration Committee, Inc.

Project Summary

The Walhalla Auditorium Restoration Committee, Inc. (WARC) is a non-profit organization dedicated to providing a first quality civic auditorium for a community that currently has no adequate resource of this kind. To meet this goal, WARC has committed itself to the restoration and renovation of the Graded School Auditorium (c. 1913) in downtown Walhalla. This beautiful old auditorium has not been used since it was abandoned by the school district in the 1980's. The completion of this \$350,000 project will enhance the cultural and educational life of Oconee County's principle town, as well as preserve the building's historical value.

Introduction

Walhalla was settled in 1849 by German immigrants. It is located at the foot of the Blue Ridge Mountains of South Carolina some fifty miles from Greenville. Today Walhalla is the seat of county government and is situated along the Heritage Corridor.

Walhalla Graded School was constructed in 1903 and is now the site of the administration offices of the county's school district. The building is listed of the National Register of Historic Places. The attached auditorium was built in 1913/1914. In addition to serving as venue for school graduations, the auditorium, with its balcony and 40-foot stage, was heavily used by community groups and as performance space by nationally recognized entertainers.

With the construction of new schools only one of which included an auditorium, the Graded School Auditorium was abandoned and gradually fell into a sad state of disrepair. Local theater and dance groups were forced to curtail their schedules or eliminate performance altogether, which led to the demise of several performing organizations.

WARC was established in 1995 by a group of concerned citizens who recognized the need for a place where area young people could further explore the arts and develop their talents, and the need to preserve a historic community building. To date, the auditorium has been cleared of debris and the floor and roof have been repaired. Funds are raised through committee membership dues and special events. Grants have been awarded by the county, the Max and Victoria Dreyfus Foundation, and the Duke Power Foundation.

Need Statement

As the county seat, Walhalla is increasingly looked to as a resource by the surrounding rural community since there is no civic auditorium within the county. The development of area music, theater (there are even hopes of establishing a Little Theater Group), and dance groups is stunted without the guarantee of adequate performing space. Without this development, the cultural enrichment of the area, as well as its arts heritage, is threatened.

The Walhalla Graded School Auditorium is of significant historic value to the community and the county. Many of its residents have memories of attending events there. With its restoration, the auditorium will come alive again with those old memories and the beginning of new ones.

- *8. <u>10-074-00150-00850 BUILDING CONTINUED:</u>
- A. REPLACE SECURITY PLUMBING AND SECURITY LICETING We are requesting \$21,000.00 to replace the security plumbing and security lighting to meet the standards. The security plumbing is so old that parts are no longer available. We will have to use retrofit fixtures that will bring the foot-candles up to 20 in all of the pre-trial side of the jail. We will also be adding some additional furniture, fixtures, and equipment to meet minimum standards in the cell areas.
- B. <u>REMODEL DETENTION FACILITY</u> We are requesting \$12,000.00 to remodel the Control Room and to build three rooms in the old juvenile cell. The much needed space will be used for a doctor examination room, supervisors' training record room, and a medical room to secure all medicines and medical records. This will also include new tile in the Control Room, Booking Room, and the Interrogation Room. We will place a fatigue mat in the Control Room. This tile will be replacing all the carpet in the Control Room and booking areas of the jail. This amount will cover all remodeling, electrical and building materials and furnishings of the new offices to include, but not limited to, file cabinets, desk and an examination table.
- C. <u>REMODEL DOWNSTAIRS</u> We are requesting \$25,000.00 to remodel all the downstairs of the Oconee Law Enforcement Center and the stairway area. This will include carpet, ADA required fixtures and door handles, furnishings, electrical, heating and air equipment, paint, security equipment and all other items needed to remodel the existing offices, including telephone lines and computer cables.
- D. HEATING AND AIR SYSTEM We are requesting \$4,000.00 to install a heating and air system for the radio equipment room of the Oconee Law Enforcement Center. We have the emergency generator and all of our radio equipment in this room located in the sally port area behind the female cells. During the heat wave last summer, we experienced a lot of problems with the radio equipment. We were advised by radio maintenance of the importance of controlling the temperature in this room. This unit would also provide some additional heat and air to the female cell that has problems during extreme heat and cold times of the year. This would extend the life of our radio equipment and cut down on the maintenance calls and down time of the system, which is vital to our 911 dispatch center.

The purpose of this correspondence is to request supplemental appropriation for line item 010-005-00150-05871. Please consider the following information:

Listed amounts are low bid and next low bid for pumper trucks and tanker trucks for fiscal year 99-2000: Smeal Fire Apparatus Company - Extended price for four (4) pumper trucks, \$875,232 including tax; American LaFrance Company - Extended price for four (4) pumper trucks, \$877,096 including tax. American LaFrance - Extended price \$284,816 including tax, on two (2) tankers; KME - Extended price \$286,664 including tax, on two (2) tankers. On line item 05871, budgeted amount reflects \$820,000 for four (4) pumper trucks and \$200,000 for two (2) tanker trucks.

These bids and specifications are still under review and a firm decision has not been made as to which company and/or company we will purchase trucks from. Therefore, we are requesting \$143,760.00 from supplemental appropriation to cover the cost of trucks in the event low bid should fail to meet specifications.



STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA COUNTY OF OCONEE ORDINANCE 2000-01

"AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 99-16 PROVIDING FOR THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS NOT TO EXCEED \$1,500,000 FROM THE FUND BALANCE ACCOUNT OF OCONEE COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF FORTY-TWO "T" HANGARS AND THREE (3) CORPORATE HANGARS AT THE OCONEE COUNTY REGIONAL AIRPORT AND OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THIRTY-EIGHT (38) "T" HANGARS AND THREE (3) CORPORATE HANGARS"

WHEREAS, the Oconee County Council adopted Ordinance 99-16 upon third and final reading on December 7, 1999; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 99-16 provides the funding of the construction of forty-two (42) "T" hangars and three (3) corporate hangars at the Oconee County Regional Airport; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the construction of forty-two "T" hangars and three (3) corporate hangars is not feasible at this time.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Oconee County Council in session duly assembled with a quorum present and voting as follows:

SECTION I: It is hereby ordered that Ordinance 99-16 is amended to provide that thirty-eight (38) "T" hangars and three (3) corporate hangars be constructed at the Oconee County Regional Airport from the funds appropriated by Ordinance 99-16 for such purpose(s) and that all unexpended funds remain in and/or revert to the fund balance account(s) of Oconee County.

SECTION II: All other terms and provisions of Ordinance 99-16 not modified directly or by implication shall likewise remain in full force and effect.

OCONEE COUNTY COUNCIL

ORDINANCE 2000-03

SECTION I: TITLE

The title of this ordinance shall be "Oconee County Animal Control Act" adding to and amending certain sections of Animal Control Ordinances 98-8.

SECTION II: DEFINITIONS

As used in this ordinance, the following terms are defined below:

- 2.1: Animal: Every non-human species of animal.
- 2.2: Animal Control Officer: Any person designated by the State of South Carolina or County Governing Authority of Oconee County as a Law Enforcement Officer pursuant to S.C. Code \$47-3-30.
- 2.3: Animal at large: Any animal not under the restraint of a person capable of controlling the animal and/or off the premises of the owner.
- 2.4: Animal Rescuer: Any recognized group or person who routinely obtains an unwanted dog or cat and/or who finds an adoptive home for that spayed or neutered dog or cat.
- 2.5: Animal Shelter: Any premises designated by the county governing body for the purpose of impounding, care, or destruction of animals held under authority of this Ordinance and/or State Law.
- 2.6: Humane Society: South Carolina Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.
- 2.7: Humane Society Officer: Any officer or employee of the Animal Shelter or Humane Society.
- 2.8: Owner: Any person, partnership, or corporation owning, keeping, or harboring one or more animals. An animal shall be declared to be harbored if it is fed for three consecutive days or more.

- 2.9: Pet or Companion Animal: Any animal kept for pleasure rather than utility; an animal of a species that has been bred and raised to live in or about the habitation of humans and is dependent on people for food and shelter.
- 2.10: Abandoned/Stray Animal: Any animal unattended for a period of more than three days.
- 2.11: Public Nuisance Animal: Any animal or animals, except those raised for food and/or food products, that unreasonably annoy humans, endanger the life or health of other citizens (other than their owners), or interfere with a citizen's enjoyment of life or property.

The term "Public Nuisance Animal" shall mean and include, but is not limited to, any animal that:

- a) is found at large after written complaint has been filed;
- b) damages the property of anyone other than its owner;
- c) molests or intimidates pedestrian or passerby;
- d) excessively makes disturbing noises, including, but not limited to, continued and repeated howling, barking, whining, or other utterances causing unreasonable annoyance, disturbance, or discomfort to neighbors or others in close proximity to the premises where the animal is kept or harbored;
- e) causes fouling of the air off the premises of the owner by odor resulting from failure to remove feces every twenty four (24) hours or washing of same into an approved underground disposal system every twenty four (24) hours;
- f) has been found by the animal control officer after notice to its owner to be a public nuisance animal by virtue of being a menace to the public health, welfare, or safety; or
- g) does not have attached a valid current rabies inoculation tag as required by State Law.

- 2.12: Under Restraint: Animals shall be deemed under restraint if it is on the premises of its owner or keeper or is accompanied by its owner or keeper and under the physical control of such owner or keeper by means of restraining devises, or under the verbal command, or under the active control of the owner or trainer while hunting or being trained and while on property of the owner or with the property owner's permission.
 - 2.13: Dangerous Animal: (A) An animal of the canine or feline family:
- (1) which the owner knows or reasonably should know has a propensity, tendency, or disposition to attack unprovoked or cause injury or otherwise endanger the safety of human beings or domestic animals; or
 - (2) which;
- (a) makes an unprovoked attack that causes bodily injury to a human being and the attack occurs in a place other than the place where the animal is confined as required by South Carolina Code Section 47-3-720; or
- (b) commits unprovoked acts in a place other than the place where the animal is confined as required by South Carolina Code Section 47-3-720 and those acts cause a person to reasonably believe that the animal will attack and cause bodily injury to a human being; or
- (3) which is owned or harbored primarily or in part for the purpose of fighting or which is trained for fighting, or
- (4) which attacks, bites, or injures a human being or domesticated animal without adequate provocation, or which, because of temperament, conditioning or training, has a known propensity to attack, bite, or injure human beings or domesticated animals.
 - (B) An animal is not a "dangerous animal" solely by virtue of its breed or species.
- 2.14: Potentially Dangerous Animal: An animal of the canine or feline family that chases or approaches any person or domestic animal, anywhere, other than on the property of the owner, in a menacing fashion or with an apparent attitude of attack including, but not limited to, behavior such as growling or snarling.

SECTION 3: AUTHORITY

This ordinance is adopted pursuant to the provisions of Sections 47-3-20, et. seq., Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976.

SECTION 4: RESTRAINT

- 4.1: All Animals shall be kept under restraint.
- 4.2: No owner shall fail to exercise proper care and control of his dog to prevent him from being a public nuisance.
- 4.3: Every female dog or cat in heat shall be confined in a building or secure enclosure in such a manner that such female dog or cat cannot come into contact with another animal except for planned breeding.
- 4.4: Every dangerous animal and potentially dangerous animal, as determined under this Ordinance shall be confined by the owner within a building or secure enclosure and shall be securely muzzled or caged whenever off the premises of its owner.

SECTION 5: BITING OR ATTACKING PERSONS

All animal bites or injuries to a human being shall be reported by medical personnel with knowledge of the bite or injury to the rabies control officer in the Department of Health and Environmental Control. Whenever the Animal Control Officer or Humane Society Officer is notified and shown that an animal has bitten or attacked a person, such officer shall promptly notify the Oconee County Department of Health and Environmental Control of such bite or attack and shall cooperate with the said health department in impounding and quarantining such animal.

SECTION 6: IMPOUNDMENT AND VIOLATION NOTICE

6.1. Unrestrained and nuisance animals, upon receipt of a written complaint signed by the complainant, may be taken by Law Enforcement Officials, Animal Control Officers and/or Humane Society Officers and impounded in the Oconee County Animal Shelter and there be confined in a humane manner.

In addition to, or in lieu of, impounding an animal at large, the Animal Control Officer or lawful constable or deputy sheriff may issue to the known owner of such animal a notice of ordinance violation. Such notice shall impose upon the owner a warning for a first offense. The owner shall be charged a penalty of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the second violation, seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) for the third violation and one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each subsequent violation. Said penalties shall be made payable to the Treasurer of Oconee County and paid at the Oconee County Animal Shelter within ten business days from the date of issuance in full satisfaction of the assessed penalty. In the event that such penalty is not paid within the time period described, a criminal warrant shall be initiated before a magistrate and upon conviction of this ordinance, the owner shall be punished as provided in Section 12 of this ordinance. In addition, the owner shall be required to pay a fee of five dollars (\$5.00) per day for each day the animal is boarded by the County, actual cost for inoculation of the animal (if applicable) and a five dollar (\$5.00) impoundment fee. In addition, at the discretion of the animal shelter, a thirty dollar (\$30.00) fee and mandatory sterilization of the animal may be required if the animal is impounded on more than one (1) occasion. Five dollars (\$5.00) shall be the impoundment fee and twenty-five (\$25.00) shall help defray the cost of sterilization. The sterilization shall not be required if the owner or other person redeeming the animal provides a written statement from a licensed veterinarian that the spay or neuter procedure would be harmful to the animal due to reasons of age or health or that the animal has already been sterilized.

- 6.2: Notwithstanding the above, the Animal Control Officer, Law Enforcement Officer and/or Humane Society Officer may without written complaint impound animals not having a valid current rabies inoculation tag and found off the owner's property.
- 6.3: Impounded dogs and cats shall not be kept for fewer than five (5) working days.

- 6.4: If by tag or other means, the owner of an impounded animal can be identified, the Animal Control Officer shall immediately upon impoundment notify the owner by telephone or certified mail. Any identifiable animal, not appearing to be abandoned, upon notification of the owner by telephone or certified mail, shall not be kept for fewer than fourteen (14) days.
- 6.5: Abandoned animals shall be impounded and shall be kept for no fewer than five (5) working days.
- 6.6: Any owner reclaiming an impounded dog or cat shall pay the fee provided for in section 6.1 before the animal can be released.
- 6.7: Any owner claiming an impounded dog or cat shall show proof that the animal is currently inoculated against rabies. If such animal is not currently inoculated against rabies the owner shall cause the animal to be inoculated at the owner's expense.
- 6.8: Any animal not reclaimed by its owner within five (5) working days, or in the case of a positively identifiable animal within two (2) weeks, shall become the property of the local government authority and shall be placed for adoption in a suitable home or humanely disposed of as approved by State Law.
- 6.9: The Animal Shelter Director shall keep complete and accurate records of the care, veterinary treatment, and disposition of all animals impounded at the shelter.
- 6.10: It shall be unlawful for any person to release or take out of impoundment any animal without proper authority.
- 6.11: It shall be unlawful to resist Humane Society Officers, Animal Control Officers or law enforcement officers engaging in the capture and impoundment of an animal.
- 6.12: It shall be unlawful to remove the rabies tag from the dog for which the tag was issued.

SECTION 7: DANGEROUS ANIMALS

- 7.1: The Animal Control Officer, Law Enforcement Officials or the Humane Society Officer shall have the power to summarily and immediately impound any animal where there is any evidence that the animal has attacked, bitten, or injured any human being. The animal shall be kept at the Oconee County Animal Shelter or at a veterinarian designated by the owner at the owner's expense for quarantine pending a determination of the animal's status as a dangerous animal. In the event that an animal bites a member of the animal owner's family, and the animal owner requests that the animal be impounded by the animal owner, the Animal Control Officer, Law Enforcement Officer or the Humane Society Officer may, in his or her discretion, allow the animal owner to impound said animal on said animal owner's property.
- 7.2: Upon impounding a potentially dangerous animal or a dangerous animal that has attacked, bitten or injured a human being or a domestic animal, a determination hearing should be conducted within five (5) business days of serving notice to the owner by certified mail or personal service. If the owner fails to appear at the hearing, the hearing shall nevertheless proceed and an appropriate order may be issued. The Magistrate shall determine whether to declare the animal to be a dangerous animal based upon the evidence and testimony presented at the hearing by the owner, witnesses to any incidents, or any other persons possessing information pertinent to such determination such as veterinarians or dog obedience trainers. The Magistrate shall issue written findings within five (5) business days after the hearing. The owner of such animal shall have a right to appeal the decision to the Court of Common Pleas of Oconee County within ten (10) days of receiving such decision of the Magistrate.
- 7.3: An animal determined to be dangerous as determined in 7.2 which has attacked or causes injury to a human being or a domestic animal may be ordered destroyed by the Magistrate when in the Magistrate's judgment the dangerous dog represents a continuing threat of serious harm to human beings or other domestic animals after the quarantine period has expired. Any dangerous animal may also be destroyed if the owner

of the dangerous animal relinquishes ownership or control of the animal to the Humane Society or law enforcement officer.

- 7.4: The owner of a dangerous animal shall secure and confine said dangerous animal on owner's property in an enclosed and locked (with a key or combination lock) pen or structure, suitable to prevent the animal from escaping said pen or structure. The pen or structure shall have secure sides and a secure top which protects the animal from the elements. Also, all sides must be embedded into the ground with no less than two (2) feet unless the bottom is secured to the sides. The structure must be kept in a clean and sanitary condition and provide adequate light and ventilation. The enclosure shall not be less than five (5) feet by ten (10) feet and not less than six (6) feet high.
- 7.5: No person owning or harboring or having care of a dangerous animal may permit the animal to go beyond the person's premises unless the dog is securely muzzled and restrained with a leash or chain having a minimum tensile strength of three hundred (300) pounds and not exceeding three (3) feet in length.

SECTION 8: POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS ANIMAL

8.1: The Animal Control Officer, Law Enforcement Officials, or the Humane Society Officer shall have the power to summarily and immediately impound any animal where there is any evidence that the animal has chased or approached any person or domestic animal, on property other than the property of the owner, in a menacing fashion or with an apparent attitude of attack, including, but not limited to behavior such as growling or snarling. The animal shall be kept at the Oconee County Animal Shelter or at a veterinarian designated by the owner at the owner's expense for quarantine pending a determination of the animal status as a potentially dangerous animal. The Animal Control Officer, Law Enforcement Officer, or the Humane Society Officer may, in his or her discretion, allow the animal owner to impound said animal on said animal owner's property.

- 8.2: Upon impounding a potentially dangerous animal, the determination should be conducted within five (5) days of serving notice to the owner by certified mail or personal service. If the owner fails to appear at the hearing, the hearing shall nevertheless proceed and an appropriate order may be issued. The Magistrate shall determine whether to declare the animal to be a potentially dangerous animal based on the evidence of testimony presented at the hearing by the owner, witnesses to any incidences, and any other persons possessing information pertinent to such determination such as veterinarians or dog obedience trainers. The Magistrate shall issue written findings within five business (5) days after the hearing. The owner of such animal shall have the right to appeal such a decision to the Court of Common Pleas of Oconee County within ten (10) days of receiving the decision of the Magistrate.
- 8.3: The owner of a potentially dangerous animal shall secure and confine said potentially dangerous animal on owner's property in an enclosed and locked (with a key or combination lock) pen or structure, suitable to prevent the animal from escaping said pen or structure. The pen or structure shall have secure sides and a secure top which protects the animal from the elements. Also, all sides must be embedded into the ground with no less than two (2) feet unless the bottom is secured to the sides. The structure must be kept in a clean and sanitary condition and provide adequate light and ventilation. The enclosure shall not be less than five (5) feet by ten (10) feet and not less than six (6) feet high.
- 8.4: No person owning or harboring or having care of a potentially dangerous animal may permit the animal to go beyond the person's premises unless the dog is securely muzzled and restrained with a leash or chain having a minimum tensile strength of three hundred (300) pounds and not exceeding three (3) feet in length.

SECTION 9: ANIMAL CARE

9.1: No owner shall fail to provide for his animals with the necessary substance, shelter, and veterinary care when needed to prevent suffering and humane care and

treatment. All animals shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition. The premises upon which animal is kept shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition and provide adequate light, shelter and ventilation.

- 9.2: No owner of an animal shall abandon such animal.
- 9.3: Any animal found abandoned and not properly cared for, appearing to be diseased or injured past recovery for any useful purpose may be lawfully destroyed by any agent of DHEC, Law Enforcement Officer, Animal Control Officer or Officer of the Humane Society by a method approved of by State Law.
- 9.4: Any animal found abandoned, neglected, cruelly treated, or unfit for use may be seized from the owners property by the Animal Control Officer, Law Enforcement Officer or Humane Society Officer and impounded at the Oconee County Animal Shelter, provided however that the officer shall give notice of this seizure by posting a copy of it at the location where the animal was seized or by delivering it to a person residing on the property of the owner within 24 hours of the time the animal was seized.
- 9.5: The owner of any animal impounded under the provisions of this section shall be responsible for payment of any necessary medical care as determined by a veterinarian in addition to any penalties, impoundment fees, and board fees.

SECTION 10: STERILIZATION

No unclaimed dog or cat shall be released for adoption without written agreement by means of a spay/neuter contract from the adopter guaranteeing that such animal will be sterilized within thirty (30) days for adults and a specified date in the contract for pups and kittens, provided however, the county provides a program whereby the spay/neuter is included with the adoption fee.

No animal shall be released for adoption from the Oconee County Animal Shelter that has not been sterilized, provided however, that the County or its contractor provides a program whereby the spay/neuter is included with the adoption fee.

SECTION 11: ENFORCEMENT

The civil and criminal provisions of the ordinance shall be enforced by those persons or agencies by the county authority. It shall be a violation of this ordinance to interfere with an animal control officer, law enforcement officer or Humane Society Officer in the performance of his/her duties.

SECTION 12: PENALTIES

12.1: Any person violating any provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall for every offense, be guilty of a misdemeanor and be punished by imprisonment in jail not exceeding thirty (30) days or by a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200.00). In addition, upon conviction of any violation under this article a court may order an animal forfeited by the owner or owners and placed with an agency willing to accept custody of the animal, where the court finds that the animal has been cruelly treated, and the cruel treatment is likely to continue; or the owners have been convicted of allowing the animal to run at large on two or more previous occasions, and the animal is likely to continue to run at large.

SECTION 13: APPLICABILITY OF RABIES CONTROL ACT:

The provisions of South Carolina Code Section 47-5-10 et seq., commonly known as the Rabies Control Act are hereby adopted in their entirety, as the same may be from time to time amended, as an integral part of this ordinance, except insofar as the provisions of such act may conflict with or be less restrictive than the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 14: CONFLICTING ORDINANCES

All other ordinances of the County of Oconee that are in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 15: SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

If any part of this ordinance shall be held invalid, such part shall be deemed severable and the invalidity thereof shall not effect the remaining parts of this ordinance.
