Dear Mr. Banks,

It has been a pleasure to work with you on the Newry utility upgrade project. It is exciting to see the project nearing completion. The purpose of this letter is to give you a status report on the engineering and construction budgets for the project.

At this time we have less than \$1,000 left in the construction observation budget. We anticipate that we will need an additional \$5,000 to complete the project.

Numerous unforeseen problems have occurred on the project including malfunctions on the sewer lift stations, utility conflicts with the service taps, permitting the wastewater treatment plant abandonment through a separate division of DHEC, and an extended construction contract, that could not have been anticipated either during the proposal stage or the design stage of the project. These conflicts required additional management services. Please be aware that we have taken every effort to incorporate these unexpected situations into the existing budget. However the number and breadth of these problems will cause us to go over the projected budget. Items that still need to be completed as part of this project include the following:

- Construction Oversight of the sewer line
- Coordinating the final certification of the lift stations with the power company and the pump manufacturer
- Certification of the abandonment of the wastewater treatment plant
- Oversee the abandonment of the water and sewer system
- Final Walkthrough with Oconee County, DOT, and SL&W
- Oversee final punch list and project closeout
- Submit final DHEC permit to operate

Please be aware that there is approximately \$52,921.89 left in the total budget (with the above requested change order in consideration). We recommend that the following items be procured with the remaining budget:

During the course of the project we were able to get DHEC to waive the requirement for on-site electrical power backup for both lift stations. This was accomplished by the fact that Seneca Light & Water has a portable generator used for backup power in emergency situations. However, after the design was completed, it came apparent that these pump stations are the largest on the Seneca Light & Water system and the emergency generator is not large enough to power either of these stations. It is our recommendation to purchase either one portable generator capable of generating electrical power to both lift stations or two permanent units at each station. The cost of installing backup emergency power at the lift stations is between \$40,000 and \$45,000. The cost is approximately the same for either the permanent or mobile system. We recommend proceeding with the most cost effective system.

Given the fact that a special purpose district is being considered by the County in which Newry might be the first system incorporated, we would recommend that a surveyed as-built be performed. This survey would identify the installed water and sewer system, water and sewer taps, hydrants, and valves. This information could then be used to establish a base map for all future systems in the special purpose district. The cost for this survey and map will be \$8,500.00.

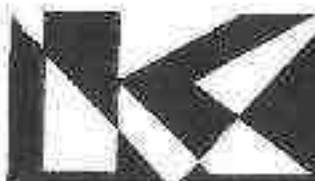
The contractor has requested additional funds to cover a bidding mistake on the project. Attached, please find letter stating the circumstance surrounding this error. Please be aware that the County is not obligated to grant this request. However, we would like to point out that this project has been an extremely challenging, both in terms of the scope of work and the complex nature on how the project was organized and constructed. The contractor has been exceptionally helpful and has done an excellent job. We have been impressed with the contractors desire to complete the task at hand without trying to take advantage of the circumstances. With this in mind, if the County wishes to consider this request, we would recommend that the remaining amount of money in the budget (approximately \$2,927,89) be allocated to this request. The total amount of the bidding error is approximately \$21,000.00.

If the council agrees with these allocations, we recommend that the paperwork for these change orders begin now so that the funds will be available at the end of the project. WE recommend that the funds will not be spent until the project is complete and there is no possibility of any further unforeseen change-orders. We appreciate your consideration of this matter. If you have any further questions or need any additional information, please let us know.

When we told them to double check with The City of Seneca, they told him that we had to use the Badger #25W/RTR. Listed below is the cost difference. I spoke with Mike Smith with The City of Seneca and asked him how long they had been using this type of meter. He said that they have been using those for 9 months. Therefore, this change would have taken place after we bid the project. The bid date was June 21, 2001.

Good day Mr. Medlin,

Here is a synopsis of our effort to quote,then supply the correct meter on the Newry job.

Our materials take-off for this project was done by Dick Blair of Hughes Supply in Charlotte. His only job is materials take-off. His take-offs are very detailed.

The original plans had two meter set details. The only part number for a meter appears on the detail marked "alternate". On that detail, there is no mention of electronics. On the unmarked detail there is a note at the bottom pointing out that meter selection and installation will be coordinated with Seneca Light and Water. Under that appears "3/4 water meter (radio transmitted)".

From the above information ,as a supplier,we could not discern if we were to quote and supply the meters to the contractor or alert our municipal salesman to attempt to sell the meters directly to Seneca Light and Water. It has been our experience that the most common scenario is for the town to buy the meter. Based on the information we had at the time of bid,with the only part number we had-Badger M25RCDL-we quoted our equivalent Hersey meter. Meter distribution is very territorial and at that point quoting our meter was our only option. Had we had a part number that designated electronics we would have quoted a Hersey meter with electronics. Our quote offered the equivalent,by part number,to the Badger M25RCDL which does not specify electronics.

As the job progressed, the time to order the meters drew near.Seneca did not want to consider the Hersey meter and asked Kris Mechanical to order the meters. At that point it became unclear what type of meter Seneca really wanted. We called Seneca directly and received a fax of the copy of the unmarked detail from the original plans. Again,there is no part number or manufacturer. This occurred on 5-09-02.

After several calls between Hughes Supply and Kris Mechanical personnel,a fax was received on 5-13-02 identifying by part number the desired meter and electronics package. Had we had that part number going into the job,we certainly would have quoted our Hersey equivalent. Even had Seneca not been interested in the Hersey package,our price would have been comparable.

From our perspective it appears the exact meter was chosen while the job was in progress.I feel everyone involved at Kris Mechanical and Hughes Supply made every effort to identify the correct meter. If there is anything further we can do to help please don't hesitate to call.
