




ORDINANCE NO. 2009-28

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ARTICLE II (NOISE) OF CHAPTER 12 OF THE OCONEE COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES IN CERTAIN LIMITED PARTICULARS, ONLY; AND OTHER MATTERS RELATED THERETO.

WHEREAS, Oconee County, a body politic and corporate and a political subdivision of the State of South Carolina (the "County"), acting by and through the Oconee County Council (the "County Council"), has heretofore, on June 16, 1998, adopted its Ordinance 98-2, the "Oconee County Noise Control Ordinance"; and,

WHEREAS, Oconee County Ordinance 98-2 has since been codified as Article II (Noise) of Chapter 12 of the Oconee County Code of Ordinances, and is currently in effect as such; and

WHEREAS, Oconee County Council has found, and hereby finds, that the reasonable control of excessive noise is an integral aspect of quality of life for the citizens of Oconee County; that reasonable balances have to be weighed and made between typical outdoor pursuits which provide for the entertainment and recreation of some of the people of Oconee County, and reasonable control of noise which, if left unabated, might deteriorate the quality of life for other Oconee County citizens; that at least one (1) day of relief by immediate neighbors from extremely noisy but otherwise lawful activity out of every seven (7) days of such activity is a reasonable requirement; that Sunday is the traditional day of rest for most Oconee County businesses which recognize such a day; that night time is the traditional "quiet time" in most neighborhoods; and, that reasonable accommodations can be made which allow for enjoyment of life and quality of life by both groups, those enjoying noisier pursuits and those seeking at least some relief from such noise; and

WHEREAS, Oconee County Council desires to adjust, modify, and amend Article II of the Chapter 12 of the Oconee County Code of Ordinances, in certain limited particulars only, in order to provide for the maximum quality of life of both groups mentioned in the preceding paragraphs;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ordained by Oconee County Council, in meeting duly assembled, that:

1. Section 12-33. Enumeration of specific nuisances, of the Oconee County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by adding a new subsection (10) to read as follows: "(10) *Automobile Racetracks*. The operation of any automobile for racing, and the operation of any facility for the conduct of automobile racing, which substantially interferes with the comfortable enjoyment of private homes by persons of ordinary sensibilities in the immediate vicinity thereof."
2. Section 12-34. Exceptions, of the Oconee County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by adding a new subsection (e), to read as follows, and renumbering all subsections of Section 12-34, thereafter: "(e) Additionally, this article does not apply to any racing automobile equipped with and using a certified automotive racing muffler system, or to any automobile racing facility, at which all participating automobiles are using such a certified automotive racing muffler system, all between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 11:30 p.m. local time, Monday through Saturday only." Additionally, subsection (e) (currently subsection (d)) of such Section 12-34 is hereby amended by adding the following sentence at the

- end of such subsection: "This exception shall not apply to the nuisance described in Section 12-33(10), which has its own exception, herein."
3. Subsection (a) of Section 12-35 of the Oconee County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by revising subsection (2) thereof, to read as follows: "(2) Issue a courtesy summons or other properly authorized citation device, for the offender to appear in Magistrate Court."
 4. Section 12-36. Penalties for violation of article, of the Oconee County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read: "Section 12-36. Penalties for violation of article. Any person violating any provision of this article shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall for every offense be punished in accordance with Section 1-7. Each day on which there is a violation of this article, or every separate and distinct event, heat, race, vehicle, or activity, in the case of 12-33(10), shall constitute a separate and distinct violation and offense under this article."
 5. Should any portion of this Ordinance be deemed unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such determination shall not affect the remaining terms and provisions of this ordinance, all of which are hereby deemed separable.
 6. All other sections, terms, conditions, and provisions of the Oconee County Code of Ordinances not affected, directly or indirectly, hereby, shall remain in full force and effect.
 7. All orders, resolutions and enactments of Oconee County Council inconsistent herewith are, to the extent of such inconsistency only, hereby repealed, revoked and rescinded.
 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after third reading and enactment by Oconee County Council.

ITEM TITLE OR DESCRIPTION:

First Reading (In Caption Only) of Ordinance 2010-03: An Ordinance to Amend the Zoning Enabling Ordinance Pursuant to a Citizen-Initiated Rezoning Request

BACKGROUND OR HISTORY:

The proposed Ordinance 2010-03 stems from a citizen-initiated rezoning request submitted by Mr. Robert Royer on November 30, 2009. The request was accompanied by the signatures of approximately 62% of the owners of the parcels proposed for rezoning. The proposal will rezone a series of 371 parcels located in the Luther Land Road and Petty Road area, near Lake Keowee, from the Control Free District (CFD). As submitted in the request, 347 parcels would be rezoned as Lake Residential District (LRD), and 24 parcels would be rezoned as Residential District (RD). It should be noted, however, that planning staff consider portions of the submitted proposal to be potentially problematic. The staff's concerns are:

- 'pockets' of differing zoning classifications would be created along some streets within existing platted developments
- a small number of individual parcels, must located on Keowee School Road and accessed primarily or exclusively from that road, and proposed for rezoning into the Lake Residential District (LRD), would better fit the Residential District (RD)





ITEM TITLE OR DESCRIPTION:

2010 Census Update and Questionnaire Center Program, Mr. William Whitney and Mr. James Alexander

BACKGROUND OR HISTORY:

Over the last couple of years, Oconee County has taken part in a number of efforts to ensure as accurate a count as possible in the upcoming 2010 Census. Included among the activities were assisting in the creation of a county-wide Complete Count Committee formed to help promote and coordinate local activities; the Planning Department's oversight of the Local Update of Area Census Address (LUACA) program, which resulted in the addition of hundreds of addresses to the Census Bureau's address list; and the recently completed update of new construction projects. As a result of these efforts, Oconee County is in a greatly improved position to receive a much better count than would otherwise have been possible.

With the census materials scheduled to be mailed to citizens in March, the Census Bureau has asked that Oconee County facilitate the creation of a local information center that will provide direct assistance to citizens seeking information, as well as help in completing the necessary questionnaires. Although important, this "Questionnaire Assistance Center" will require only enough space for a table and chairs, as well as an area where Census Bureau staff can hold private discussions with citizens. To that end, the Census Bureau is requesting the donation of a small, easily accessible, highly-visible area in the Pace Street Administrative Complex.

The Questionnaire Assistance Center (QAC) program will run from March 19th through April 19th of this year, with some specialized centers beginning on February 26th.

CONDITIONS FOR DONATION OF SERVICES AND SPACE AGREEMENT 2010 Census

The common goal of the U.S. Census Bureau and the Donor is to achieve a complete and accurate count in the 2010 Census.

A. Donation of Space

Under the guidance of the U.S. Census Bureau, the Donor agrees to provide space for a Questionnaire Assistance Center (QAC) within the property of their organization for the purpose of helping other persons who request assistance in completing the 2010 Census questionnaire.

This donation is subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. The Donor will provide space for the QAC at the following times and on the following days: _____ The U.S. Census Bureau expects post usage of the Questionnaire Assistance Centers to extend from March 10, 2010 to April 19, 2010. It would be most beneficial to the enumerator if the person working at this QAC spoke the following language(s): _____
2. The U.S. Census Bureau will not reimburse the Donor Organization for any expenses related to the provision of the QAC space.
3. Questionnaire assistance will be provided without any charge whatsoever to the respondent.
4. The U.S. Census Bureau will provide a poster and/or a banner to be placed at the Authorized Questionnaire Assistance Center designating those spaces as U.S. Census Bureau sanctioned assistance centers. A Be Counted box will be available on the premises for the respondent to indicate a Be Counted questionnaire if they did not receive one at their place of residence or they believe they were not exposed to this specific questionnaire unit in their place of residence.
5. The Donor organization agrees to provide or to arrange for the provision of sufficient space to be used as Questionnaire Assistance Centers during the 2010 Census. Questionnaire Assistance Center Representatives (QAC Reps) will occupy the space and provide assistance to those respondents who visit the Questionnaire Assistance Centers.

This condition is subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. The _____ (organization) will donate _____ square feet of office space in _____ (existing name), at _____ (address), _____ (City, State, and Zip Code) for a period of _____ (number of weeks), commencing on _____ (date) through _____ (date).
2. The space shall accommodate one (1) desk for interviewing and two (2) chairs in which the QAC rep may interview privately and/or independently the respondent(s) seeking assistance.
3. The space is being donated to the U.S. Census Bureau at no cost to the government.

B. Liability

In the event that injury or damage is caused a U.S. Census Bureau employee while acting within the scope of his or her authority, the incident will be covered under the Federal Tort Claims Act, Title 28 U.S.C. §2672, et seq. Any claims arising from such incidents may be filed with the U.S. Census Bureau and will be promptly addressed.

Any injury occurring to a U.S. Census Bureau employee while acting within the scope of his or her employment will be covered under the Federal Employees Compensation Act, Title 5 U.S.C. §8101 et seq.

Because the Federal Government is self-insured, it is the U.S. Census Bureau's policy not to purchase or pay for commercial liability insurance. In addition, the Anti-Jonesboro Act, 149-31, US C. § 301, et seq., prohibits any Federal agency from undertaking contingent and undetermined liability without funds being appropriated by Congress for such purposes. For this reason, the Government cannot agree to a "Hold-Harmless" clause that will limit its right to sue.

ITEM TITLE OR DESCRIPTION:

The Oconee County Emergency Services Department requests permission to apply for a USDA Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS) Grant, Emergency Watershed Protection Grant, on behalf of the Whitewater Lake Association.

BACKGROUND OR HISTORY:

The Whitewater Lake Association requested from USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service technical and financial assistance through the Emergency Watershed Protection Program. Assistance is needed to repair damages to the exit slope of the emergency spillway of their 46 acre lake. (An emergency spillway is a structure with specific design dimensions to safely discharge floodwaters during a significant storm event.) September 20, 2009 rains, an approximate 50 year storm event, caused damage to the emergency spillway including severe erosion at the upper end of the exit slope and total failure at the point of outlet into the stream. A previous attempt to stabilize the outlet with concrete and rip rap has been destroyed, leaving a tremendous cut 30 feet long by 30 feet wide. Also of concern is the level section of the emergency spillway, intersected by Whitewater Lake Road, a county road. Should the upper end of the exit slope fail in a future storm event, the county road (level section) may also be damaged or destroyed, potentially compromising the dam itself.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS OR CONCERNs:

The Emergency Watershed Protection Program requires a local sponsor (governmental entity) who will provide a minimum of 25% of the total cost of repairs through either cash or in-kind services. The sponsor must also provide a design for the repair by a SC Licensed Professional Engineer. The engineer will oversee construction and certify repairs. After certification, USDA-NRCS will reimburse the sponsor for 75% of the total cost of repairs. In addition, the sponsor will be paid for administrative costs, including engineering or other professional services, equal to 10% of USDA-NRCS reimbursed amount. The sponsor may choose to contract with another entity to carry out their responsibilities through a separate contract or Memorandum of Understanding. The Whitewater Lake Association has requested assistance from Oconee County in applying for funds through the NRCS Emergency Watershed Protection Grant as all applicants are required to be governmental entities.

It should be noted that damage to the Whitewater Lake reservoir dam has raised concerns regarding the potential impacts to the Whitewater Lake Road. This is a county road and all efforts to further its stabilization should be taken into consideration.

A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) will need to be drawn up by the County Attorney to define the responsibilities of Oconee County as the pass-through agency and the Whitewater Lake Association as the party responsible for the matching grant funds as well as any overhead charges related to engineering or construction. Details regarding the MOU will be further defined at a later date.

BACKGROUND OR HISTORY:

The bid document for Road Paving listed specific requirements that the contractor must follow. Specific roads along with the type of paving work required were listed in the bid with estimated quantities. Also the bid allowed for the cost of asphalt materials to be indexed to the SCDOT liquid asphalt index and this cost to be reviewed once a month to determine the price of the asphalt mix.

On January 12, 2010, formal sealed bids were opened. Twenty-eight companies were originally notified of this bid opportunity, eight companies attended the mandatory pre-bid meeting and six companies submitted bids, with Venesky Asphalt Paving & Grading, LLC, of Easley, SC, submitting the lowest bid of \$1,068,281.81. Staff from Procurement and the Roads Department checked references provided and met with the owner of Venesky Asphalt Paving & Grading, LLC, prior to the award of bid, to determine that he was a responsible bidder and would comply with all of the County's paving requirements as stated in the bid document.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS OR CONCERNs:

A protest was received on this bid, protesting that the County allowed Venesky Asphalt Paving & Grading to qualify their bid by writing in the amount of the performance and payment bond. Attached is a copy of Venesky's bid form that clearly shows the amount of the bond to be calculated at two percent of the total amount. Staff responded to this protest and recommends proceeding with the award.

STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA

COUNTY OF OCONEE

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 3rd day of February, 2010, by and between OCONEE COUNTY, South Carolina (hereinafter "the COUNTY") and, Venesky Asphalt & Grading LLC (hereinafter "the CONTRACTOR").

1. SCOPE OF WORK

- ε For and in consideration of the unit prices hereinafter specified, (see Attachment A and B), CONTRACTOR agrees to perform on behalf of the COUNTY certain roadwork and asphalting at the direction of Oconee County, the total of such work not to exceed \$1,068,281.81 dollars. The Roads and Bridges Manager of Oconee County shall elect roads to be set up and asphalted by the CONTRACTOR at the prices stated in the contractor's bid proposal.

2. PROGRESS PAYMENTS

Payments are to be made for work described above on the tenth (10th) day of the month or as mutually agreed in writing by the County and the Contractor. However, CONTRACTOR agrees to pay, as liquidated damages, the sum of one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars per day for all days in excess of agreed completion date listed below under Section 3, Contract Period.

Therefore, the COUNTY shall retain 10% of all payments to insure payment of any liquidated damages as may occur and to insure full compliance with the contract.

3. CONTRACT PERIOD

The Contract Period and effective term of the Agreement shall run on or about February 2, 2010 until June 30, 2010, unless the parties mutually agree in writing to extend the same.

4. OBLIGATIONS OF CONTRACTOR

- ε The CONTRACTOR shall furnish, for a contract price specified herein, all labor, materials, equipment, machinery and supplies necessary to perform and complete surfacing of the roads according to the general plans and specifications, to cause to be paid subcontractors, material, men and suppliers for such equipment, as well as any lessors thereof.
- ε CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all Federal, state and local laws and regulations with regard to road construction and paving.
- ε CONTRACTOR shall employ certified personnel and equipment to prepare daily

analysis reports that provide information regarding plant mix, including bitumen content, gradation, marshal stability. The COUNTY shall be supplied with a copy of this daily analysis report. If CONTRACTOR is turning State work and COUNTY work simultaneously, the CONTRACTOR will submit a copy of the State's analysis report in lieu of a separate report for the COUNTY work. COUNTY reserves the right at its discretion, to employ a qualified independent testing agency to perform testing at the plant site or from the product delivered to the job site, using CONTRACTOR'S equipment at no additional cost to the COUNTY, to verify that specified mix design is being batched.

- d. Prior to any payment, CONTRACTOR will furnish to the COUNTY a performance bond and payment surety in the sum of \$1,068,281.81 dollars issued by a good and sufficient surety company licensed to do business in the State of South Carolina. Said bond shall be acquired by the CONTRACTOR at its own expense and provide appropriate provisions warranting that the construction and work performed by the CONTRACTOR or its employees or subcontractors shall be free of defects in workmanship and materials for a period of one (1) year from date of acceptance of the total contract by the COUNTY.
- e. CONTRACTOR will furnish to the COUNTY proof to the satisfaction of the County that the CONTRACTOR is licensed to do business in the State of South Carolina.
- f. CONTRACTOR shall submit proof of valid policies currently in force for worker's compensation insurance for all employees of the CONTRACTOR, as well as public liability insurance of at least \$5,000,000 limit.
- g. CONTRACTOR shall furnish at all times in all phases of construction qualified key personnel including, but not limited to, operators, laborers, one foreman, plus sufficient trucks and drivers.
- h. CONTRACTOR may assign only one crew at a time to COUNTY work, unless approved by the Oconee County Roads and Bridges Manager at least 24-hours prior to second crew beginning work. No asphalt work is authorized without an Oconee County Inspector on site. Any work done without an Oconee County Inspector present is subject to removal and replacement solely at the CONTRACTOR'S expense.

5. DUTIES AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE COUNTY

- a. COUNTY shall pay CONTRACTOR for work and service performed by it according to the provisions of this agreement in the manner specified herein.
- b. The COUNTY warrants that it has sufficient and valid right-of-ways for the roads upon which CONTRACTOR is to perform services. The COUNTY will, on a regular basis, consult with and be available for direction and designation of work to be done according to the terms of the Agreement, in such a manner as to prevent undue stoppage or delay of work on the part of the CONTRACTOR.

- c. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this agreement, the parties understand and agree that nothing herein shall require the COUNTY to designate any specific amount of work for the CONTRACTOR and its crew to perform and may elect to work or cause to be reworked only such of its roads as it deems to be in the best interests and needs, not to exceed the maximum contract sum specified herein, all without the consent of the CONTRACTOR.

6. GOVERNING LAW

- The parties mutually agree that the terms and conditions herein shall be governed by and construed under the laws of the State of South Carolina, and that any controversy hereunder shall be submitted to and裁决 within the jurisdiction of the Courts of Oconee County, S.C.
- The specifications and bid package #69-10, which was duly awarded by the Oconee County Council are hereby made an integral part of this contract by reference and is to be adhered to unless specifically altered by this contract.

Review & Discussion regarding Plans for Joint Fire Station:

Mr. McCall asked Mr. Lake Julian and Mr. Danny Ard to step forward and address the Committee regarding issues related to the plans for the joint fire station with the City of Westminster.

Mr. Julian first discussed "alternatives" [page 5] from the J. Davis Cost Budget dated May 2009. Mr. Julian and Mr. Ard addressed several of the issues in some length.

It was the consensus of the committee that no additional items be added and no items be deducted from the cost budget.

Mr. Ard presented two plans for the Committee review [A101, Rev N and A101, Rev. I] and discussion. The committee reviewed aspects of both plans - discussion followed.

It was the consensus of the committee to recommend to full Council for final approval plan A101, Rev N.

Public Comment:

Mr. McCall opened the floor for Public Comment.

Mr. Berry Nichols addressed the Committee regarding several concerns to include: [1] DHEC permitting, [2] the bid process, [3] the inspection process for the building, [4] additional proposed road for access, and [5] questioning the firmness of the budget.

Ms. Susie Cornelius addressed the Committee regarding several concerns to include: [1] utilizing funding originally designated for Solid Waste and the burden to the tax payer [letter provided as backup to this point filed with these minutes], [2] location, [3] OMC ambulances in the station without a formal contract, and [4] Emergency Operation Plan/Duke name confusion.

New Business:

Ingress/Egress for the Joint Fire Station:

Mr. McCall asked Mr. David Smith, Westminster City Administrator, about ingress and egress. Both Mr. Smith and Chief Smith stated that this would be on Norris Street and they stated that no additional road will be constructed for the station.

Status regarding Use of Lights/Sirens upon Exit from the Joint Fire Station:

Mr. McCall questioned if an agreement had been made with local citizens to alter the lights/siren policy for this station. Chief Smith explained that lights are turned on while still in the fire station and that the siren will be turned on by the time the truck reaches the public street. He stated that if a citizen could hear the siren before at the intersection they will still hear the siren - no change. He also stated that no agreement has been made to alter their normal procedures.
