Project Title: *Two Additional Interpretive Signs*

Description of project: *This grant request is for designing, printing and building two additional interpretive signs for visitors to the Foothills Farmstead (see attachments). One sign would contain the original floorplan drawing of the farmhouse that we are reassembling. When visitors come by the farmstead during OPEN hours, they would be able to visualize the house as it is being reassembled. The second sign would be to illustrate the process by which we disassemble and reassemble historic structures. This includes tagging each board, drawing in a "map book" and then removal followed by rebuilding. The entire process would be explained using sample photos (see attachments) and procedural descriptions. Each sign is 3' x 4' printed on weather resistant material (including fading). The signs are then mounted on frames and 4" x 4" posts that are painted white. These proposed signs would be in the same matching style as two existing signs (see attachments).*

The Main Farmhouse originally sat approximately 1 mile from this location. The date of construction is unknown but the style reflects a late nineteenth-century house. Andrew Bearden is known to have built the house probably after he returned from the Civil War.

However, when the house was disassembled in order to move, it was discovered that the structure was originally a "Post & Beam," two-room house made, in part, with hand-hewn beams. It is thus probable that the original structure predates the Civil War.

The house features 6 rooms (3 on each side) with a hallway down the middle. All interior walls and ceilings are made with hand-planed, pine boards. It contains 3 fireplaces and chimneys including one used for cooking in the kitchen.

The notable wrap-around porch with Folk-Victorian embellishments was built c.1915.

In the 1930s, the Patrick Henry Gambrell family acquired the farmhouse and surrounding acreage. The family lived here until 1985. Vacant since then (except for being used as a wood shop), it was disassembled starting in 2013 to become the Main Farmhouse of the Foothills Farmstead.

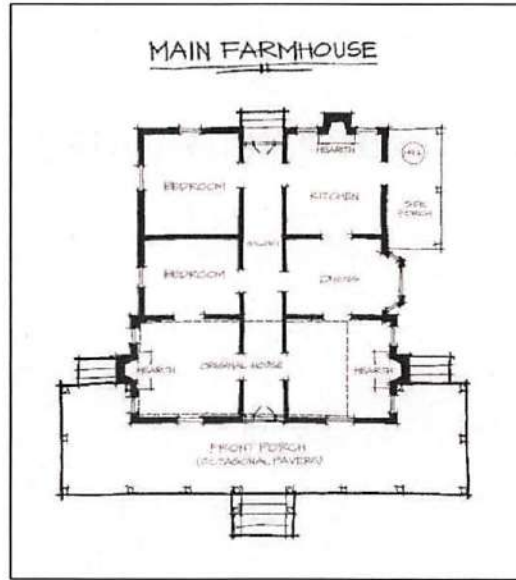

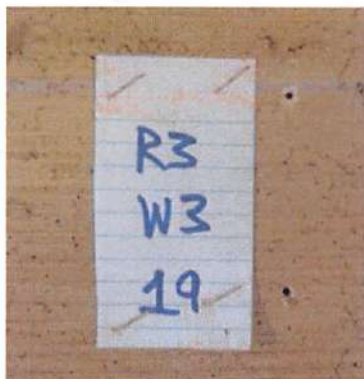

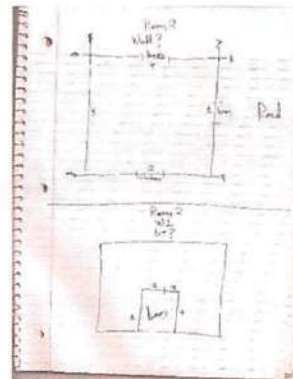
