Public Comments

1. Encourage water companies to require fire hydrants and water line upgrades but also have some type of payback for the entity upgrading the lines as other come on to it.
2. County needs to figure out how much water is available in the County for development before water and sewer is expanded. An inventory of water needs to be done.
3. Go back and revisit Infrastructure Master Plan; update it and set goals for water and sewer
4. Get the Infrastructure Master Plan adopted
5. Education needs to include job training beyond local school district, we are doing a great job at this and need to keep it up with places like Tri-County Tech., Hamilton Career Center and programs such as Worklink
6. Schools need to be placed in populated areas with reference to available infrastructure and ingress and egress
7. Schools need to open facilities to public; especially libraries
8. Schools and Libraries need to get together on resources.
9. Recreation Center is a good idea but need to look at options other than public money. Options may include YMCA, Private Partnerships or other forms alternative financing. This can be done without county money.
10. Community Facilities should look at needs over wants
11. 1% sales tax is something that the needs to be forgotten and we need to concentrate on facilities that are fee payer based
